Sunday Mornings in August

Pre-K(4) and Kindergarten

*These new policies are an attempt NOT to eliminate the risk of spreading COVID-19 but to reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19. Each family has to decide whether or not we have reduced the risk enough for them.

Extended Lesson Time

- Kids will have an extended worship and lesson time with organized games/activities
- Seating will be spaced 6' apart—siblings can sit next to each other if desired, but family units will be socially distanced
- Activity supplies will be individually packaged
- Kids will have a reduced free-play time

Facial Coverings

- Facial coverings will be required for SK! staff and volunteers
- Facial coverings will be recommended for kids over the age of 2 (unless mandated by the local government)
- Those people unable to wear a mask for medical or other reasons will be exempt from wearing one
- Disposable masks will be available for families who want them

Attendance

- Parents/guardians will use check-in computers and sign-in sheets
- SK! staff will keep sign-in sheets for 4 weeks to help with contact tracing

Sanitation

- SK! Staff will use disinfectant spray to clean check-in computers between services
- SK! staff will stock rooms with ½ of the toys and do a toy swap between services. After the 11:00 service, SK! staff will use disinfectant spray on all the toys
- SK! staff/volunteers will use disinfectant spray to clean the rooms after each service
- Bottles of hand sanitizer will be in every room and hand sanitizer dispensers will be in the main gathering areas and entrances/exits

Snacks

- Individually packaged snacks only will be provided. (Due to the high cost of individually packaged goldfish, SK! staff/volunteers will follow CDC guidelines for food prep to make an individual package of goldfish for each child.)
- Kids will need to bring their own water

Symptom Checks

- All SK! staff and volunteers will get a temp check upon arrival at the facility
- Parents will be asked to check their kids for the following symptoms at home before coming to the facility:
 - Fever (100.4) or chills

- Loss of taste or smell
- Muscle or body aches
- Newly developed cough
- Newly developed shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Newly developed sore throat
- Newly developed congestion or runny nose
- Newly developed nausea or vomiting
- Newly developed diarrhea

Other

- At drop-off and pick-up, please be courteous of those around you and try to maintain social distancing of 6 feet between families. The entrances to all our classrooms are quite narrow, so floor markings will be provided for assistance.
- Parents/guardians may remain with their child as long as the parents/guardians wear facial coverings
