

Ice Breaker Question:
Have you ever traveled to another country where you didn't speak the language? What was that like for you?

Read and discuss Mark 12:28-31, Acts 2:1-15, 22-24, 36-41.

1. In Jerusalem at Pentecost, there were people from many backgrounds who spoke different languages. In Indianapolis, there are thousands of people from many backgrounds who speak different languages. How can we be sensitive to neighbors around us from different backgrounds?
2. The disciples are filled with the Holy Spirit on Pentecost, and quickly 3,000 people come to know Jesus that day (Acts 2:41). Jesus talked about the coming of the Spirit in John 14:15-21, 25-27. What do you know about the Holy Spirit?
3. The Spirit of God disrupted the lives of the disciples at Pentecost. Can you remember a time when the Spirit of God disrupted your life?
4. The people in this story were "amazed and perplexed" (verse 12) at hearing the message in their own language. What might we do that would amaze and perplex our neighbors enough that they would want to hear more about Jesus?
5. The disciples and followers of Jesus (about 120 people) were quiet before Acts 2. The Holy Spirit made them bold about their faith. Would you describe yourself as bold in your faith? Can you tell about a time when you were bold in your faith?
6. Listening to other people's stories is a big part of speaking their language. We can learn much by listening to others. Do you know someone who is a good listener? What makes them a good listener?
7. One way to tell others about Jesus, as Peter does throughout Acts 2, is to invite and include them in things you are doing. Brainstorm with your group what events you might invite or include your neighbors to join you in attending.
