Week 4 | 4.30.23 Seeing Jesus Anew

Scripture: Luke 9:10-17

Group gathering question:

Did you participate in Super Servant Sunday? Do you currently have a place or a way to serve or did you see one/ sign up for one last week?

Read this week's scripture and discuss:

- 1. When the disciples return from ministry, Jesus and the disciples "withdrew by themselves." We see Jesus doing this in other scripture passages as well. Why do you think this is important? What are some ways that you recharge and how has that been beneficial?
- 2. Returning from a busy event or coming down from a spiritual high, how would you cope if God gave you a new challenge as he did to the disciples here in this story?
- 3. Reading verses 11-13, how do you account for the differences in the way Jesus and the disciples view the crowd?
- 4. How do the disciples have a realistic approach to feeding the crowd? How does Jesus have a supernatural approach? When in your life do you need to take a realistic approach and when do you need to lean on Jesus for a supernatural approach?
- 5. Jesus gives thanks and breaks the bread (and apparently performs the miracle). Then how does he include the disciples? Why does he still include them even though they wanted to send the people away?
- 6. What do you learn about Jesus in this short passage? It says that Jesus gave thanks before breaking bread. For what can you give thanks in your own life and at meals with others?
