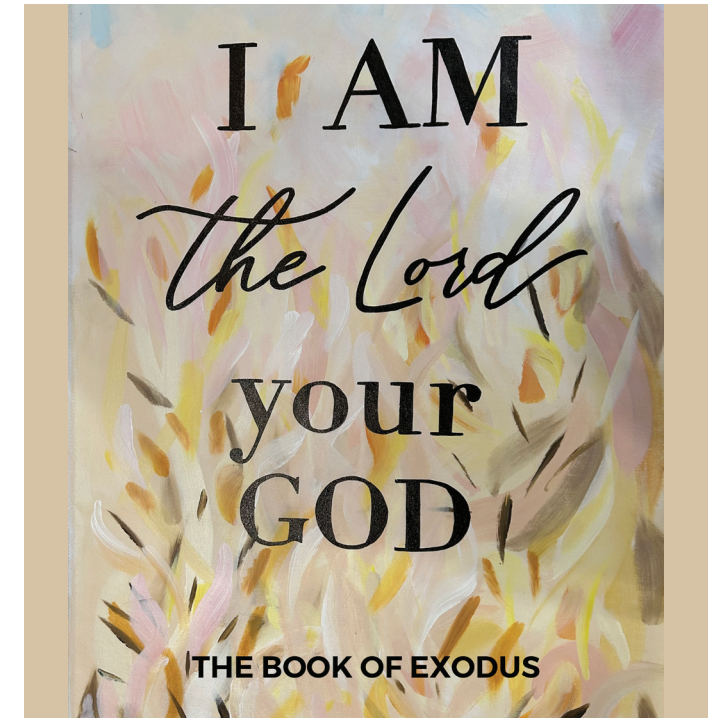



HOME GROUP QUESTIONS

Week 10 | 11.17.24
The Book of Exodus

Scripture:
Exodus 12:1-14

Group Gathering Question:

God instructed (through Moses) the Israelites to eat in haste. What is your favorite fast food? Or what is a favorite food easy to prepare at home and quick to eat?

Read this week's Scripture and discuss these questions. Exodus 12:1-14

1. Why does it matter this month is to be the first month of the year for Israelites? Is something symbolic or meaningful? Does a certain month have a great meaning for you or your family?
2. Of the many specific instructions for the Passover meal, what are a few that stand out to you, seem unique, or even strange? (See study guide for a list of God's instructions.)
3. God instructs the Israelites to sacrifice a lamb for Passover with detail. Jesus and his disciples were at a Passover meal when he shared the Last Supper, which became our Communion. What in this explanation of the Passover meal in chapter 12 reminds you of Communion and why?
4. Death itself will take the firstborn son of Egyptian families while "passing over" Israelite families who have blood on their doorposts. Does this seem fair? Is it difficult to understand God's actions and God's judgment on Egypt?
5. God says the Israelites should commemorate the Passover meal for generations to come. How do ceremonies or celebrations today help you remember to keep your faith and traditions alive for the next generation? How are these important to you: family dinner nights, baptisms, Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter?
