HOME GROUP QUESTIONS

Week 4 | 4.26.26
Resurrection Stories

Scripture:
Luke 24:13-34

Discover

1. What was one of the best walks or hikes you've ever taken? Why was it special? What was the best conversation you've had in the last 2 weeks? Why was it special?
2. Please read the scripture (all or part of Luke 24:13-35). Imagine yourself walking home on that first Easter Sunday (perhaps sad, confused, or hopeful). What would it have felt like to be walking with Jesus and hear him share the scriptures? Or break bread with Jesus and see him up close? What questions might you ask?

Learn

3. Jesus starts this conversation with a question: "What are you discussing with each other while you walk along?" He then keeps going by asking soon after: "What things?" Why do you think Jesus asks so many questions? What is good about asking questions?
4. Why would Jesus choose to take time to explain to them what had happened by looking at scripture instead of simply revealing himself to them?

5. Frederick Buechner says that Emmaus is wherever it is we go to escape. What is your Emmaus? In what way is this Emmaus a good place for you? In what way is it unhelpful?
6. The disciples are on a journey and in the end they discover that Jesus has been with them all along. As you consider your own journey what are ways that Jesus has revealed himself to you, remembering that so often these ways seem at first quite ordinary?
