


About Juvenile Justice Ministry

INDIANAPOLIS DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY SIX FOCUS AREAS



Current Ministry Inside the Facility

Tuesday Men's Group: 6-7:30pm

Tuesday Women's Group: 6-7:30pm (2nd and 4th)

Thursday Skills Classes: 3-5pm or 7:30-8:30pm

- Mandatory for all youth to attend (80-150+ kids)
- Lead & engage kids in life skills programming
- We have been asked not to share any explicitly "religious" content during this time, but JJM is finding subtle ways to mix in stories that point to Christ.

Saturday Small Group: 10-11am

- · Optional for kids to attend
- · Actively share biblical truths
- Engage kids in a deeper way

Connection Team: throughout the week

- Develop relationships with the kids
- Engage kids in activities such as playing basketball

One-on-One Mentorship

 Investing time in a one-on-one relationship with the kids in the facility

One-on-One Mentorship
