

Snapshot: *Professional Coaching Course (PCC)*

Accreditation	The PCC is accredited by the International Coaching Federation as an Accredited Coach Training Program (ACTP)
Outcomes	<p>Graduates of the PCC will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Develop their own coaching practice ▪ Add to a current consulting practice ▪ Provide professional-level coaching within their organization ▪ Fully integrate coaching into their leadership
Number of participants	We limit our course participation to 20 students.
Duration	One year
Face-to-face sessions	There are four classroom sessions. Sessions I, III and IV are four days long (Thursday through Sunday). Session II is five days long (Wednesday through Sunday). We begin at 9:00 am and end at 7:00 pm each day.
Locations	San Francisco, Washington DC, Montréal, Cape Town, London, Singapore
Frequency	Groups start four times a year in San Francisco and once or twice a year in most other cities.
Tuition	\$11,200 in the US. This includes all four classroom sessions, books, materials, pod meetings, coaching sessions, mentoring and certification.
Application process	A fully completed application with essays, a JPEG photo and a \$500 non-refundable deposit are required for consideration.
Prerequisite	In the US, either the two-day <i>Coaching to Excellence</i> course or the three-day <i>Integral Coaching Principles</i> course (for experienced coaches).
Organization of the course	<p>The PCC takes place over one year. It includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Four face-to-face sessions ▪ Individual integral development program custom-designed for you ▪ Individual coaching and mentoring from course faculty ▪ Feedback on your coaching in both written and verbal forms ▪ Regular meetings with small group pod and with pod guide ▪ “Coach’s Bookshelf,” a list of books to read for the course ▪ Written assignments ▪ Certification process
Estimated time needed	Students report that they spend an average of five to ten hours a week engaging in course work.
