Greek film DOGTOOTH features a stupendously dysfunctional family v parents who hold some bizarre ideas as tohow their children should be raised. The family exists in strict isolation - to the point of developing their own language and unique meanings for common words - the father being the only one allowed to leave their country house. The only outsider allowed in is the young woman paid by the father to 'satisfy' the teenage son. In a mini-society so delicately balanced, it's only a matter of time before matters go dangerously awry. Somewhat improbably, DOGTOOTH has been nominated for Best Foreign Language Film at this year's Oscars – an unusually oddball choice in this typically staid category.

And, although we couldn't secure a print Yates directed a strange little drama about slacker ambulance drivers called Mother, Juggs & Speed that we recommend you seek out.



BULLITT is a film of superlatives. It's arguably Steve McQueen's best and tightest film. It includes some of the most exciting car chases ever committee to celluloid and it's consistently ranked amongst the greatest city portrai films ever – with San Francisco clearly acting as a star of the movie. Not only that, but it is one badass cops and robbers film with McQueen's cop determined to find out who is trying to sabotage a mafia trial.




