TRIPLE THREATS: THE INFERNAL AFFAIRS TRILOGY

Often called Hong Kong's answer to The Godfather, the Infernal Affairs trilogy marked the last gasp of the city's once-prolific film industry. Beneath its cop-versus-triad thrills lies a sharp metaphor for the Chinese takeover, with dual identities mirroring Hong Kong's own post-handover struggles. Though many know it only as the source for Scorsese's The Departed, the trilogy is smarter, stronger, and best experienced on the big screen.

A TASTE OF TARKOVSKY

Widely considered one of the greatest directors in cinema history, Tarkovsky's films explore spiritual and metaphysical themes with dreamlike visual imagery, luxuriously long takes and a preoccupation with nature and memory. Here, we screen four of the five films he made in the Soviet Union.

This program seeks to answer that question through some of the greatest and most selfreflexive films ever made.
















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

SOLARIS (1972)

Director: Andrei Tarkovsky | USSR

In Tarkovsky's most famous work, often described as "A Soviet Space Odyssey", a psychologist is sent to a space station orbiting a distant planet in order to discover what has caused the crew to go insane. Not only one of the greatest sci-fi films ever made, but one of the greatest explorations of the nature and reality of the human personality.

Director: Andrei Tarkovsky | USSR

A guide leads two men through an area known as the Zone to find a room that grants wishes. Widely considered Tarkovsky's masterpiece, this is a mesmerising work that offers new insights with every viewing. It's influence over filmmakers from David Lynch to Steven Spielberg is obvious.



DOUBLE INDEMNITY (1944)

Director: Billy Wilder | US

An insurance representative is seduced by a dissatisfied housewife into a scheme of insurance fraud and murder that arouses the suspicion of his colleague, a claims investigator. Not only a contender for the greatest ever film noir, this film could well be the best film of the 1940s.



THE POSTMAN ALWAYS RINGS TWICE (1946)

Director: Tay Garnett | USA

In this smart and exquisitely tense adaptation of James M Cain's genre defining novel, a married woman and a drifter fall in love and plot to murder her husband. Better than the remake in every way and containing enough moral ambiguity to call it more a "film gris", a sub genre of "film noir



BRIGHTON ROCK (1948)

Director: John Boulting | UK

One of the darkest films ever made in Britain, The grimy noir tells of a small-time gang leader who murders a journalist and later desperately tries to cover his tracks only to get into trouble with the police, a few witnesses, and a rival gang.



ANGEL HEART (1987)

Director: Alan Parker | USA

In 1955 New Orleans, small-time private investigator Harry Angel is hired by a man who calls himself Louis Cypher to track down a singer named Johnny Favorite, but the investigation takes an unexpected and somber turn. This nightmare logic neo-noir remains one of the definitive thrillers of the 80s



A. CONFIDENTIAL (1997)

Director: Curtis Hanson | USA

As corruption grows in 1950s Los Angeles, three policemen - one strait-laced, one brutal, and one sleazy the works of Federico Fellini, Sergio Leone, Johnnie - investigate a series of murders with their own brand of To and John Woo tells the archetypal tale of high justice. Featuring a stelar cast and widely considered the best noir this side of Chinatown.



A BITTERSWEET LIFE (2005)

Director: Kim Jee-woon | KR

BARTON FINK (1991)

Director: Joel & Ethan Coen | USA

In this noir-tinged ode to writer's block, a renowned New York playwright is enticed to California to write for the movies and discovers the hellish truth of Hollywood. With a never better John Tuturro and John Goodman, this film puts the classic in cult classic



MEDIUM COOL (1969)

Director: Haskell Wexler | USA

A TV news reporter finds himself becoming personally involved in the violence that erupts around the 1968 Democratic National Convention. Taking cues from the French New Wave and applying them to an America that seems to be tearing itself apart. Today, the issues of race and poverty remain as urgent today as they did



THE BAD AND THE BEAUTIFUL (1952)

Director: Vincente Minnelli | USA

An unscrupulous movie producer uses an actress, a director and a writer to achieve success... so clearly this is a pretty honest depiction of Hollywood. This wry studio picture manages to simultaneously skewer and glorify tinseltown and won five Oscars for doing so.



SUNSET BOULEVARD (1950)

Director: Billy Wilder | US

Billy Wilder's black comedy film noir is widely considered one of the greatest films of all time and certainly the greatest film about Hollywood. From the opening shot of William Holden's dead narrator, floating in a pool, it is clear this film is unlike anything else from the era. Nominated for 11 Academy Awards and winning 3.



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
