SUGARCANE, the debut feature documentary from Julian Brave NoiseCat and Emily Kassie, is an epic cinematic portrait of a community during a moment of international reckoning. In 2021, unmarked graves were discovered on the grounds of an Indian residential school run by the Catholic Church in Canada, sparking a national outcry and setting off searches across North America. After years of silence, the forced separation, assimilation and abuse many children experienced at these segregated boarding schools is coming to light. Set amidst a groundbreaking investigation, SUGARCANE illuminates the heartbreak and beauty of a community breaking cycles of intergenerational trauma and finding the strength to survive.

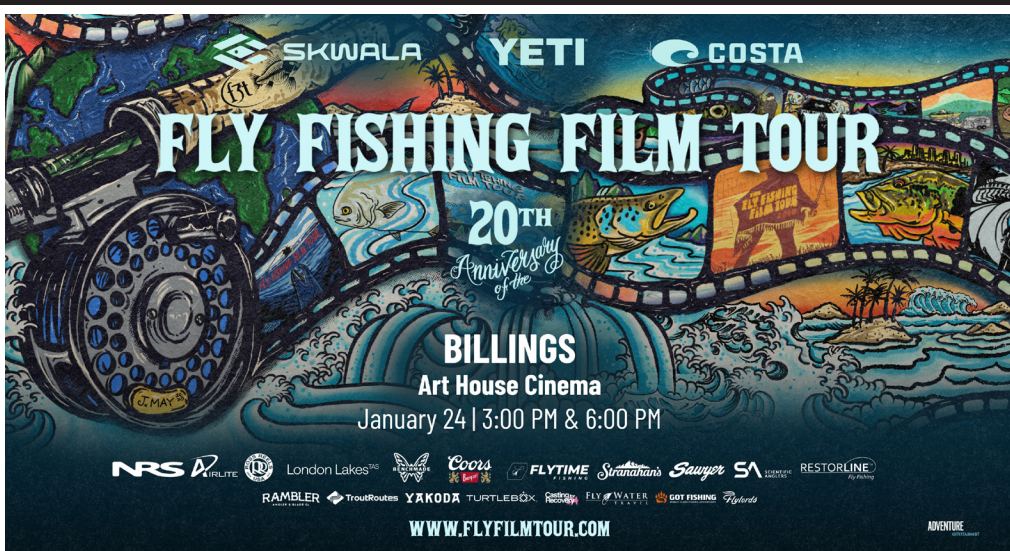

Big Medicine: York Outdoors is a documentary that tells the story of York, the only Black member of the Lewis and Clark Expedition. Enslaved by Captain William Clark, York's contributions as a hunter, caretaker, and cultural bridge with Native Nations were so significant that the Arikara people called him Big Medicine. The film retraces parts of his journey along Montana's Upper Missouri River Bypass, highlighting both his overlooked legacy and the modern importance of representation in outdoor spaces.

R | 2025 | S KOREA | 139 MIN COMEDY/THRILLER

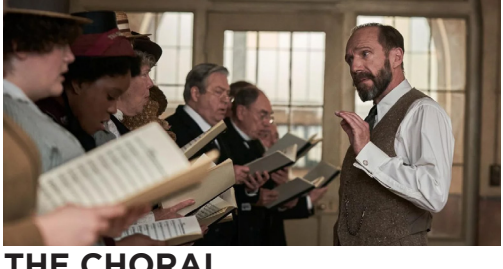
After being unemployed for several years, a man devises a unique plan to secure a new job: eliminate his competition.

R | 2025 | UK | 137 MIN DRAMA/MUSICAL

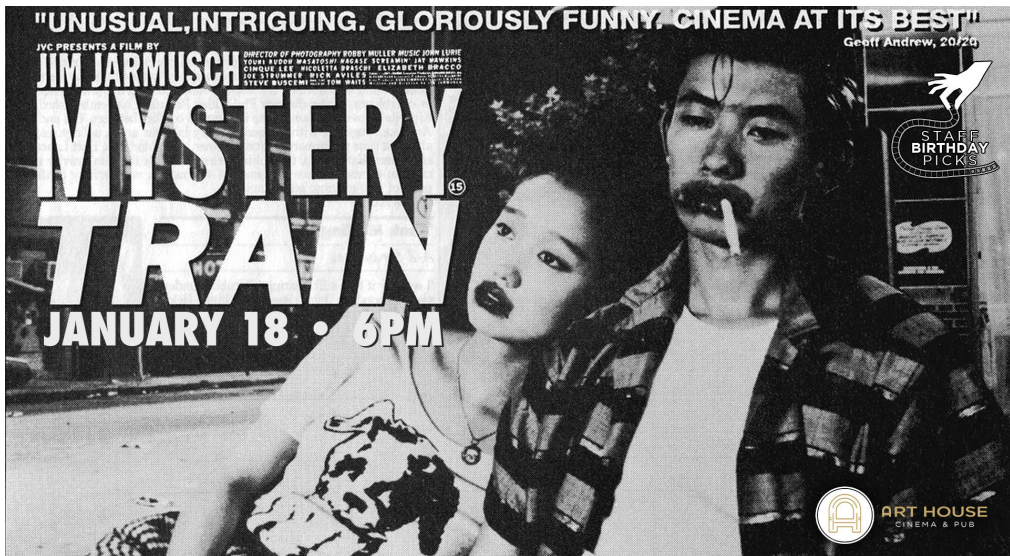

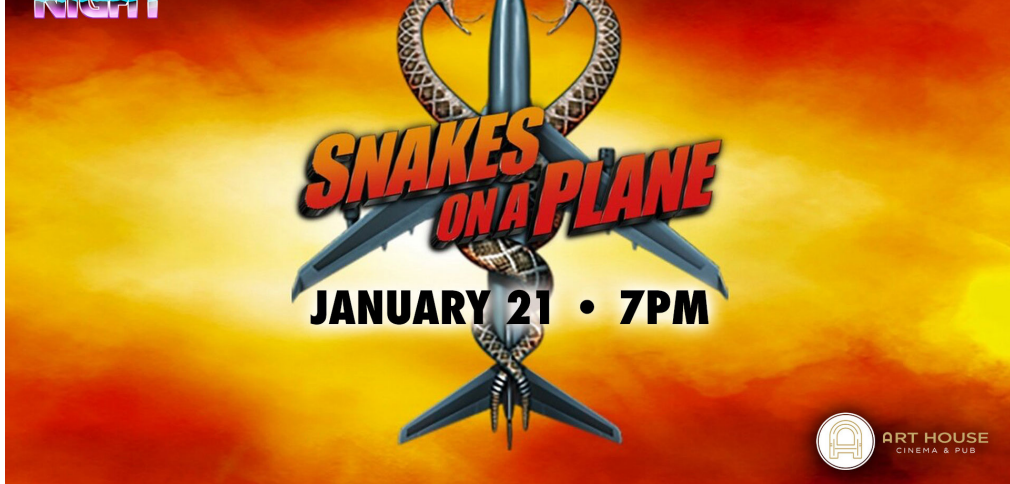
After a famous author is rescued from a car crash by a fan of his novels, he comes to realize that the care he is receiving is only the beginning of a nightmare of captivity and abuse.
