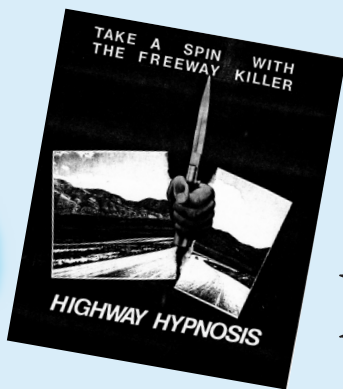
Programming Notes

Winnipeg Underground Film Festival returns to the Dave Barber Cinematheque from June 4 - 7! Visit winnipeguff.com for the full schedule.



Kamal Aljafari's *With Hasan in Gaza* opens June 10. Constructed from three MiniDV tapes shot in Gaza in 2001 and rediscovered years later, the film transforms recovered footage into a profound cinematic meditation on memory, loss, and the passage of time.

Kunsang Kyirong's *100 Sunset* follows two young Tibetan women navigating friendship, disappearance, and a quiet economy of survival in Toronto's Parkdale neighborhood. Shot with non-professional actors and embedded in real community locations, the film offers a rare and intimate portrait of diasporic life. Opens June 10.



Join us June 11 for Cult-O-Rama, featuring *Highway Hypnosis* and *Shock Video*, two films by underground auteur Ken Camp. Unseen since its 1984 premiere at West Hollywood's EZTV Video Gallery, Ken Camp's *Highway Hypnosis* is a disturbing meditation on the eroticism of violence and a major work of both narrative video art and queer horror. Constructed from footage shot for his as-of-yet unfinished Super 8 horror feature *After the Comet*, Ken Camp's *Shock Video* is a disturbing reflection of the filmmaker's time living in San Francisco during the latter half of the 1970s. Featuring a prerecorded introduction from Elizabeth Purchell, a Brooklyn-based queer film historian, programmer, filmmaker, and the founder of Muscle Distribution.



Join us June 12 for *Dash Jam*, a short documentary series featuring the late, great filmmaker and musician Jaimz Asmundson, interviewing an incredible, diverse selection of prominent local Winnipeg musicians. Presented and curated by Karen Asmundson, featuring a mid-screening discussion moderated by Abby Falvo. Join us after the screening for a reception in the Artspace lobby.

Nechako: It Will Be a Big River Again is a crucial documentary from Lyana Patrick that follows two Indigenous Nations fighting for our collective future. Presented in partnership with Urban Shaman Contemporary Aboriginal Art, *Nechako* plays June 17. This event is free to attend! Space may be limited, so please book your seat online to secure a spot.

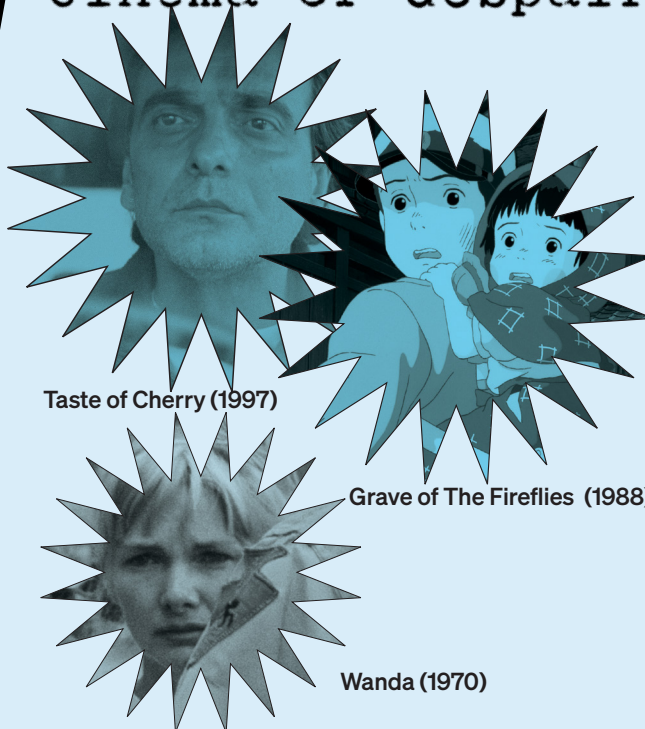

Presented in partnership with the American Cinematheque, the Dave Barber Cinematheque is thrilled to present *Bleak Week: Cinema of Despair*, a weeklong festival that spotlights some of the greatest films from around the world that explore the darkest sides of humanity, as well as some of the bleakest points in human history.

Who was Dave Barber?

Dave Barber was the programmer at the Winnipeg Film Group's Cinematheque since its inception in 1982. He was a crucial figure in the development of independent cinema in Winnipeg and an outstanding ally to generations of Winnipeg filmmakers. Dave passed away in 2021. On the celebration of what would have been his 68th birthday, we officially renamed the theatre Dave Barber Cinematheque in his honour.
