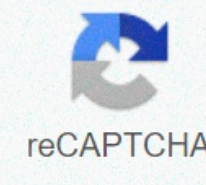

## Dougherty county jail report february 2019

The new National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) As of September 3, 2019, the Albany Police Department will be recast from the Single Crime Reporting Program (UCR) to the National Incident Reporting System (NIBRS) to comply with a directive from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation. All agencies that reported their crime statistics to the Federal Bureau of Investigation had to be nibrs in line by October 1, 2019. Because of this conversion, we were unable to account for our crime statistics for the last quarter of 2019 until we had comparable data. I have included information explaining what NIBRS is and how it can be used by any law enforcement agency. The UCR National Incident Reporting System was initiated and developed by the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) in 1930, and congressional approval allowed the FBI to serve as the national clearing house for statistical information on crime. As UCR is a comprehensive reporting system, data on individual cases of crime are not readily available. Summary-based methodology, despite its reliability, is limited in many aspects, including lack of information on crimes, arrest and victim/offender relationships. Recognizing these limitations, the FBI created the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS). NIBRS collects data on each incident and the arrest in 24 categories of crimes consists of 52 specific crimes called Crime Groups, which contain specific facts about each crime reported by local law enforcement. In addition, there are 10 categories of Group B offenses for which only arrest data are reported. Each NIBRS offense falls into one of three categories: crimes against persons, crimes against property and crimes against society. In UCR reports, the hierarchy rule requires LEAs to report only the most serious offense per incident; therefore, they do not report lower-listed offenses in several-offense incidents. For NIBRS, LEAs must report all crimes within a specific offense. The incident may include, for example, offenses of rape, theft of motor vehicles and kidnapping/kidnapping. LEAS must ensure that each crime is reported as a separate, distinct crime and not just part of another crime. The contribution of NIBRS: NIBRS is an indispensable tool in the war on crime because it is able to produce detailed, accurate and meaningful data. The NIBRS shall identify precisely when and where crime is committed, what form it takes and the characteristics of its victims and perpetrators. Armed with this information, law enforcement agencies can better define the resources they need to fight crime, as well as use resources in the most efficient and efficient way possible. The records section also reports crime data to the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's Georgia Criminal Information Center, which eventually says our crime data to the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Our monthly statistics are snapshot records in our computer that are constantly changing as cases of work and crimes are solved. Inmates can be filtered out through their first name, last name, middle name, gender, age, race, primary charge, date of arrest, and booking agency.Dougherty County Jail InmatesImportant jail policies and proceduresFor visiting, inmates will have to fill out a visitation form at the time of booking and after every two months. Only visitors on a guest list filled in by prisoners will be able to visit. All visitors must show valid state or government-issued identification cards, such as a valid driver's license, passport or military id card. All visitors must be at least 16 years old to visit. Visitors must report at least 30 minutes at the reception prior to the visit. Each visitor can visit only once a week. Visits are limited to 15 minutes. Sex offenders are required to register on the state or county sex offenders register. Those who do not register with the state can be charged with a crime. Georgia Sex Offender RegistryBail and Bondsman If you have been arrested in Georgia on a state felony or misdemeanor charge and have custody set up, there are four ways to post bonds for your release, such as signing bonds, cash bonds, property bonds, and bond bonding agencies. Posting bonds allows the defendant to leave prison while ensuring he is shown to answer all charges in future court dates. If the defendant who disclosed the detention is not arrested, a warrant will be issued for their arrest. In Georgia, the percentage that a bond agency can charge is higher than the national average of 10%. In Georgia, between 12% and 15% are commonplace in terms of the non-refundable amount of the fee that the Agency requests for their services. There are other agencies that provide credit services if the defendant does not have the money needed to charge the bond agency. Collateral such as property or vehicle is commonly used.
