

**Part 1: Brainstorm! THIS IS A BRAIN STORM, USE RAPID FIRE ANSWERS, CALL OUT your ideas for topics, do not discuss or comment on anyone's suggestions. Have 2 notetakers write down all of the answers on the board. 10 minutes**

**Prompt:** You will participate in One Day on Earth by creating video or photographs, brainstorm what topics you want to do as a class project. To help inform your decision, think of the following questions:

- How would you share your creativity?
- What about your life, your family, your culture, or your community would you want to share?
- Is there a cause that you would like to raise awareness about through your participation?
- What inspires you to make videos?
- What picture would you take that no one has seen before?
- What do you think is the most important thing to know for a person who has never been to your community, town, city, state or country?
- Is there someone you know or a group of people in your community that is helping to make the world a better place, who are they and what are they doing?
- What about your community would you like to show people 500 years in the future? What would you like to have been able to see 500 years ago?

- Once time is up, take a break, and look at what is written on the board.
- Combine similarities, and cross out duplications.
- Out of the topics left on the board choose one topic that interests you.
- Break into groups based on topic choices.

### **Part 2: Break out groups discussion 10 minutes**

Now that you have a potential topic, answer the following questions with your group.

- What resources are needed to cover this topic, and are those resources available to you?
- What skills are needed to cover this topic?
- Can you document your topic in one day?
- Is your topic physically safe to film?
- Is your topic appropriate for your community?
- Is there a specific location where your topic must be documented? If not, what location can you think of that would support your topic?



### **Part 3: Break out Group REPORTS and Final Decision 10 minutes**

- Step 1- Regroup choose one student to report on the feedback from your breakout discussion.
- Step 2- Based on group reports, cross out any topics that are not feasible.
- Step 3- Collectively, or individually, decide on a final topic from those left on the board as the subject of your project.

**Assignment: Write a one page paper on the topic you have chosen to document on 10.10.10.**

**Please explain, in writing:**

- the topic you chose
- why you chose it
- how you will document it
- for how long of a time period do you plan to shoot: time of day, hours, minutes
- what resources you will need to document your topic
- the location you will document your topic in
- what importance this topic has to you and your class
- what importance you believe this topic will have to the world
