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## Baermann clarinet book pdf

The Baermann clarinet scales, better known as the Carl Baermann, Complete Method for Clarinet, Third Division, Op. 63. This scale method book is very often used with advanced high school students and in many conservatories and schools of music. It's an advanced book. Baermann scales on Amazon.com You have three very useful options or versions of this method (read explanations of the differences below): The most commonly used Langenus version. This Snavelly version keeps all different scale types organized based on a key signature. This Dowani version has a CD example with it. For example, the Langenus version of Baermann clarinet scales is organized: No. 1 – All twelve large bowls with relative melodic small scales that go the range of the clarinet. Each bowl is completed with its arpeggio ascending to the top scale, tonic note. This book did a good job of covering the enharmonic F#major/Gb large and relative melodic small scales of d#minor/low ebb small scales. On page five, after the large and small scales, you will find the chromatic scale from low e to super high c (above the treble staff five ledger lines and one space). No. 2 - All large and small broken chord passage No. 3 - Reduced chords of the seventh - broken in various inversions of chords No. 4 - All large and small interrupted scales - I usually mention these fours when you raise four notes at a time c d e f and then descend to the next scale tone d g g, then e f g a, etc ... These patterns are very useful when learning your scales. No. 4.5 – Broken chords – a different inversion and pattern than number 2 no. The pattern then rises and falls. It only covers the 12 large scales No. 6 - Chords of the seventh on the large scales only (small chords of the seventh are not covered here) No. 7 - Various chords no. 8 - Scales in thirds (covers all large and small keys) No. 9 - Sixth Mr Baermann offers the advice here for number 10-12 that no pace is marked and that the player adjust these exercises to their ability. He also mentions that the performer will hardly be able to play this exercise right through. No. 10 - Octaves No. 11 - Staccato and Trill Exercise - Four pages of sixteenth note articulation with numerous challenges of trill study No. 12 - Exercise for Triplets - This is another four pages of sixteenth triplets Baermann scales - as organized by Jack Snavelly Above, you can see the commonly used Langenus version where many of us poor juices had to turn pages to work on all scale variations. Mr. Snavelly in this edition, has put together all the 'C large' scale patterns so you can cover that scale and then move on to the next one. Mr. Snavelly also has scales not available in the original Baermann book: whole tone, scales in 4ths, and natural/harmonic small scales The CD with this Baermann method gives you three tempi, slow, medium and quick exercise. Having the example of a professional clarinetist work through these scales for you to listen to and practice with is worth his weight in gold.
