

On 06/06/16 at approximately 1348 hours I, Officer Kennerly, was dispatched to a motor vehicle crash at Woodlands Parkway/IH 45, in the eastbound lanes of Woodlands Parkway. Upon my arrival, I observed Montgomery County Medic 25 was on scene and taking care of the Unit 1 driver, later identified as Joseph Edward Mihalov, Texas driver's license number xxx. Mihalov was unresponsive to the paramedics. Mihalov was immediately transported to Memorial Hermann, The Woodlands. I also observed three vehicles on location. Unit 1, a silver 2014 Chevy Cruze, Texas license plate number HBB0150; and Unit 2, a black 2016 Ford Explorer, Texas license plate number HKB9013, which was the crash I was dispatched to. The Unit 2 driver, identified as Steven Ward, Texas driver's license number xxx, was struck by Unit 1 from behind while traveling eastbound on Woodlands Parkway. The third vehicle on scene, was a white 2011 BMW, Texas license plate number BTW5725. The driver of the BMW, identified as Janice Shaw, Texas driver's license number xxx, advised that the Unit 1 vehicle struck her from behind, not once, but twice, approximately a half a mile from this crash, and then went around her. After going around her, Mihalov then struck Ward's vehicle from behind, not once, but twice as well. Ward and Shaw were both given insurance information and were released. I went to the Hospital to check Mihalov's condition, but he was still out of it. It is possible he had been taking prescription medication. A bottle of hydrocodone was found in his passenger seat. The prescription was filled on 06/03/16, with a total of 30 pills, with instructions to take 1 to 2 pills every 6 hours. There were eleven and a half pills left in the bottle. It is unknown if that was the reason for his erratic driving or not though. On 06/06/16 at approximately 1745 hour I, Officer Kennerly, went back up to the hospital to check on Mihalov again. I spoke with Gladys Garrison, a registered nurse and Mihalov's attending nurse. She advised that he was calling someone to come and get him, and that he was about to be released. I asked her if his blood work had come back yet. She advised yes. Garrison said he had traces of benzodiazepines, opiates, and TCH. I went to speak with Mihalov at that time. I advised him that he crashed into two separate vehicles, hitting them two times a piece. He advised he did not remember any of that. I asked him what he had been taking today. He advised he took 2 vicodin and 2 hydrocodone. At that point, I called Bill at the DA Intake to make sure they would accept charges on him. I also advised him of Mihalov's broken shoulder, which was broken prior to the crash. He advised he would accept the charges, but said to call Male Booking to make sure they would accept him with the broken shoulder. I called Male Booking and they advised that if the hospital was releasing Mihalov, to bring his

discharge papers, and they would take him. At that point, I placed Mihalov in custody, searched him for any drugs or weapons, and placed him in my back seat behind me. Due to Mihalov's broken shoulder, I did not place handcuffs on him. While en route to my Police Department for paperwork, I saw and heard Mihalov moving around quite a bit. I asked him what he was doing, and he said he was getting his wallet out. A few seconds later, I looked in my rear view mirror and noticed he had something in his mouth. I immediately stopped the vehicle and opened his door. I asked him to open his mouth and when he did, I observed a white chewed up pill. I told him to spit it out. He started spitting, but apparently swallowed the pill in the process. I asked him what kind of pill he swallowed and he advised a vicodin. I got him to the PD to do booking paperwork and about 45 minutes later, I heard a loud noise. Mihalov was sitting on our holding bench with one handcuff on him. Mihalov somehow had removed the handcuff and then passed out. When Mihalov passed out he had fallen off the holding bench and had hit the door in front of him, leaving a mark on his left upper eye. He was completely out of it. I called EMS to come and transport him back to the hospital. Medic 25, the same medics who were out on him earlier, made the scene, and transported him to Memorial Hermann again. Warrants will be sought for driving while intoxicated and tampering with evidence at a later date. Individual crash reports were completed for both crashes. The first being 16p002646 and the other being 16p002666.

On 06/07/2016 at approximately 2347 hours I, Officer Stafford (Unit 2723), observed a silver Toyota 4-Runner, bearing Texas license plate 6LNLG, that pulled out of the McDonald's at Rayford and the IH 45 northbound feeder front of my patrol vehicle. The vehicle failed to speed up. Since the vehicle didn't speed up, it caused me to have to hit my brakes to keep from hitting the rear end of the vehicle. I ran the license plate of the vehicle through the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office Dispatch and discovered that the insurance was expired as of 01/30/2016. I followed the vehicle as it entered the IH 45 northbound main lanes. Upon getting to the overpass of Woodlands Parkway, I activated my emergency lights in an attempt to get the vehicle to exit onto the feeder road for the traffic stop. The vehicle failed to take the exit and pulled over in the 27500 block of IH 45 North.

I exited my patrol vehicle and made contact with a Hispanic female, identified as Rosa Maria Flores (xxx) from her Texas Identification card. While speaking

with Rosa about why she was stopped, I asked if she had a driver's license. She stated that she didn't. I asked about the insurance for the vehicle and Rosa said that she didn't have valid insurance at this time. I returned to my patrol vehicle and ran Rosa through MCSO dispatch. When I received the return, I was advised that Rosa's license was suspended and that she had five active warrants for her arrest out of Montgomery County Precinct 1. The warrants were for Speeding - 10% above the posted speed - #1CC11870, Fail to maintain financial responsibility - #1CC11871, Failure to appear - #1CC11869A, No DL when unlicensed - #1CC11869, and a Capias Pro Fine warrant for Parent contributing to non-attendance with a fine amount of \$396.50. I advised MCSO dispatch to confirm the active warrants.

I exited my patrol vehicle, made contact with Rosa, and advised her that she had active warrants. Rosa exited the vehicle and I asked her if she had anything illegal in the vehicle. She stated that she had a small amount of marijuana in her purse in the passenger front seat. I went to the vehicle and located the marijuana along with a marijuana grinder. Due to the marijuana being a small amount, I had Rosa sign a destruction affidavit and had her destroy the marijuana in front of my patrol vehicle by pouring it out and grinding it into the ground. I issued Rosa citation 805713 for fail to maintain financial responsibility, driving while license invalid, and possession of drug paraphernalia. After writing the citation, I was advised by MCSO dispatch that the warrants were confirmed. Rosa was placed under arrest and transported to MCSO female booking without any further incident. Rosa's vehicle was towed by Towncenter Towing, chip #74, to 28075 Robinson Road in fair condition. Rosa is aware of the tow location.

When I returned to the Oak Ridge North PD office, I took a picture of the marijuana grinder and placed the photo onto the patrol room computer. The grinder was destroyed and put into the dumpster at the office.

End Report.

On 06-08-2016 at approximately 1317 hours I, Officer Henry, riding with Officer Teske, was advised by MCSO Dispatch of a criminal trespass call at BioTech, located at 506 Alana Lane. Upon arrival I met with the reportee, Jason Pitman, w/m dob xxx. Pitman advised that he is an owner of Biotech, and has been in dispute with Richard Harden (w/m, dob xxx), owner of

Discount Quality Car Care. Discount Quality Car Care is located next door to the east at 508 Alana Lane. Pitman advised that he and Harden went to civil court over a property line dispute between their properties. It was determined that a common gravel driveway between the properties was to be spilt down the middle, and Harden was allowed to use a 20 foot easement to the west of the center line for travel to and from a business he owns on the south side of the property. Pitman advised that on 06/08/2016 at approximately 0400 hours, Harden arrived on location and spray painted a line down the middle of the driveway marking the property line. Harden also spray painted several lines at the 20 foot easement mark, and on a wooden fence on the south end of Pitman's property. During the same time period, Harden walked across the 20 foot easement line and into the BioTech property, committing the offense of criminal trespass. Pitman advised that Harden was previously issued a criminal trespass warning. I was able to determine that a criminal trespass warning was issued to Harden on 07/21/2015 for the BioTech property located at 506 Alana Lane. Pitman wished to pursue charges against Harden for the offense of criminal mischief.

Pitman advised that he and Harden exchanged words, prior to my arrival on scene, about the property line and Harden coming on his property. He advised that Harden went to a white Chevrolet P/U parked on the Discount Quality Car Care property and Pitman heard what sounded like a gun racking. He then saw Harden walking towards the property line holding a black cloth gun case. Pitman advised that Harden pointed the gun case in his direction and he asked Harden if he was pointing a gun at him. He advised that Harden then didn't say anything and walked away. Pitman never saw a firearm but was concerned that Harden had guns on the property.

Pitman advised that he would provide a written statement to the ORNPD about the event. He also advised that he had a video recording showing a male he believed to be Harden trespassing on his property. Pitman advised he would provide a copy of the video to the ORNPD for evidence.

Officer Kipness retrieved Pitman's statement and a video of the alleged offense. I turned the statement in with this report. The video was downloaded to a CDR disk marked Bio-Tech 6/8/16. The disk was marked and tagged and placed into evidence at the ORNPD.

On Wednesday, 06-08-16, at approximately 1410 hrs I, Officer James Kipness of the ORNPD, arrived at Discount Quality Car Care (508 Alana Ln.) to speak with Richard Harden. Mr. Harden is owner of the business and wished to speak to an Officer regarding the ongoing dispute that he's had with Biotech Pest Control (506 Alana Ln.) Mr. Harden advised that the dispute is over the property line and easement line between the two businesses. Earlier that morning, he had spray painted a solid orange line to mark the property line and a dotted orange line to mark the easement line. Mr. Harden informed me that at approximately 0900 hrs. a woman, who he identified as Vanessa (the daughter of Jason Pitman, owner of Biotech), was driving a white Honda Pilot into the easement driveway. Mr. Harden observed Vanessa drive down the driveway and cross over the solid orange line and on to the property of Discount Quality Car Care. He then observed her make a u-turn and spin the tires of the Honda Pilot, causing the gravel to be dug up. Mr. Harden then asked her to refrain from crossing the property line. Vanessa rolled down her window, and replied "Huh? Huh?" in a mocking tone, as if she couldn't hear him. Vanessa then returned to the parking lot of Biotech, exited her car, and entered the business. Mr. Harden advised that he wished to file trespassing charges against Vanessa. After gathering information for this report, I returned to service. End of narrative.

On 06/09/2016 at approximately 0402 hours I, Officer Stafford (Unit 2723), observed a white Toyota Camry, bearing Texas license plate DHH0336, that was traveling south on Hanna at Robinson. The vehicle failed to come to a complete stop at the stop sign before it turned west onto Robinson. The vehicle then turned into the parking lot of the Oak Ridge North City Hall located at 27424 Robinson Road. The vehicle parked by the front entrance of City Hall with the headlights on for a few minutes and then turned the lights off. I made contact with the driver of the vehicle since nobody should have been at City Hall at that time.

As I was driving up to the vehicle, I saw a white female exit the driver's door and start walking back to my patrol vehicle. The female was identified as Sarah Emily Thornton (DOB xxx) from her temporary Texas driver's license paper. While speaking with Sarah, she stated that she needed a welfare check done at her residence, since she had done something bad tonight and was scared to go home. I asked Sarah what she had done wrong. Sarah stated that she was driving down Sleepy Hollow Road and saw a unidentified male that

she knew. Sarah said that she stopped, picked the male up, and let him drive her vehicle. Sarah said that they drove to the Tamina area and bought some crack cocaine. After that she dropped the male off but didn't say where she dropped him off. Sarah said she then drove straight to Oak Ridge North PD so that she could have me do a welfare check on her residence and that she needed help.

I asked Sarah if she had anything illegal in the vehicle. She stated not that she knew of. I asked for consent to search the vehicle and Sarah stated that I could. I advised Sarah to stand at the front of my patrol vehicle so I could do a search of her vehicle. I started searching the vehicle and located several small pieces of a yellowish colored rock that was identified as crack cocaine, from my training and experience as a Police Officer, on the passenger floorboard. I gathered up the pieces of crack and placed them into a property bag. I tested a piece of the crack using a NIK test kit. It had a positive test result for cocaine. While testing the cocaine, I asked Sarah how much the cocaine cost. She stated that she gave all the money that she had to the guy, and that it was about \$15.00. After finding the cocaine, I placed Sarah under arrest and transported her to MCSO female booking without any further incident. Sarah's vehicle was towed by Keith's Towing, chip # 012, to 27424 Robinson Rd, Conroe, TX in fair condition. Sarah is aware of the tow location.

After placing Sarah into MCSO custody, I went back to the office and weighed the cocaine. The cocaine was weighed using an Ohaus triple beam balance. It showed to have a total weight of 0.3 grams. It was placed into the evidence locker at Oak Ridge North PD.

End Report. (Chief's note: Ya can't make this stuff up folks.....)

On 06-08-2016 at approximately 1015 hours I, Officer Teske, with Officers Henry and Craig, took a civil service call at 27233 Lana Lane at the the residence of Mary Federlein w/f dob xxx. Mrs. Federlein advised that her grandson, Nathaniel (Nathan) Gray w/m dob xxx, was on location and was using the home as his current residence. She advised that Nathan needed a residence for probation and she recently signed an affidavit stating this was his current residence. She advised that after she signed the affidavit he took his clothes off and walked around the house in his underwear. She advised

that she is scared of him because she believes that he is on some type of drugs. She advised that an unknown male recently brought him a package, where they met at the end of the driveway. She believed this to be a drug transaction, but he told her the male only dropped off cigarettes for him. She advised that she has asked him to leave, but he won't leave and told her that she has to evict him. She advised that she spoke with officers last night that told her that he could not be forced to leave, and she would have to evict him. She advised that she turned the electricity off at the breaker last night and put a lock on the breaker box. The breaker box is located on the back side or north side of the house. I observed damage to the breaker box where the sides had been bent open and there was a screw driver still sticking out the side of the breaker box. I contacted the on call ADA and was advised that charges would not be accepted for criminal mischief to the breaker box because he had a right to be there as a resident. Nathan advised that he did break into the breaker box to turn the power back on because she turned it off. He stated that he couldn't stay there without power. Officer Craig and I asked him if he would willingly leave the property and he stated that he had nowhere to go. We asked if he had a job and he stated that he can't get a job because his grandmother won't give him the password to her computer and he isn't going to walk himself to job interviews. Mrs. Federlein advised that she would leave the residence and stay with family until the situation resolved itself. Nathan and I discussed the error of his ways and we were unable to concur on a solution. Nathan was of the belief that he is a victim and he has done nothing wrong. I advised him that what he is doing to his grandmother is wrong.

On 06-10-2016 at approx. 11:07 am, I, Officer R.E. Craig III, was on routine patrol when I received a call from the office in reference to a Trespasser/ Suspicious person call at 27233 Lana Ln which is in the City of Oak Ridge North. I responded to this address as did Sgt. D. Barry who was also on regular patrol this day. The address I was responding to is a residential home owned by the reportee Mary Federlein. The reportee stated there was a U Haul van backed up to her garage door and there was an unknown female on location with her grandson Nathaniel Gray. Once I arrived on location I met with the reportee and she stated that she wants to make sure that her

grandson and this unknown female were not taking anything from the residence.

I need to state that this is the second time that I have been to this residence this week. There is a dispute on whether Nathaniel lives at the residence or if he is just a visitor. He states that he lives here and is entitled to stay here until he finds another place to live even though his grandmother no longer wants him at the residence. Nathaniel had admitted to me that he has abused drugs in the past but is now clean. His grandmother feels that he may be using drugs again and this is part of the reason she no longer wants him in the house. She advised me that she has become afraid of him and that he may be bringing an unwanted element into her house. I also would like to state that over the past few years I have been to the reportees house to take reports or follow up on others issues that she has had. At the times that I been to the residence the reportees home has been very clean and well kept. The reportee is very particular about the interior and exterior of her home.

Well I finally walked up the driveway to find Nathaniel on the patio area between the garage and the house. I asked him what was going on and why was there a U Haul backed up to the garage of his grandmothers house. He stated that it was just a friend visiting. The friend was a white female that was identified by name and date of birth as Teressa Lynnea Tanner W/F, xxx. She appeared to be very nervous when she noticed the police at the residence. I asked if there was anything in the U Haul that came from this residence. The Tanner subject stated that all the stuff in the van was hers and there is nothing from this house inside of it. I then asked Nathaniel why he has not moved out yet. He stated that he did not have a place to go. He stated that he does not have a car nor does he have access to the Internet to look for a job. I asked the Tanner subject if she could allow Nathaniel to go with her and she stated that he could move in with her and her mom for as long as he needed. I told Nathaniel this and he agreed to go with the Tanner subject. But then he quickly changed his mind. On this day Officers were at the location for over an hour. Chief Walters conferred with the MC District Attorneys Office and was able to get charges accepted for Criminal Trespass if the subject refused to leave. Chief Walters advised me of this fact. At that, I then advised Nathaniel that he was going to be issued a Criminal Trespass Warning and if he refused to leave the location he was going to jail for Criminal Trespass. I explained to him that this is not his residence and his grandmother has become afraid of him and the element that he has brought into her home. Nathaniel has not

paid any money to his grandmother and there has not been any written agreement to allow him to live at this residence that I am aware of. I then had dispatch check the Tanner subjects criminal history, and I was looking for any drug offenses. Dispatch then advised me that The Tanner subject had been handled in 2015 for felony Possession of a Controlled Substance and for Larceny and FTA's in Montgomery County. At this point a Criminal Trespass Warning citation # 71721 was issued to Nathaniel Shane Gray W/M, xxx, TXDL# xxx, for this address 27233 Lana Ln Oak Ridge North, Texas 77385. He gathered his belongings and left the location. As he was gathering his belongings I noticed that the house was a complete mess. The house smelled of cigarette smoke and had dirty clothes on the living room and in the kitchen there were dirty dishes piled up in the sink. The Tanner subject was given a verbal Trespass Warning and advised not to return to this residence again.

There is another incident report # 10605, that has been completed by unit # 2712 M. Teske in reference to the incident earlier in the week.

On 06/11/2016 at approximately 2230 hours I, Officer Stafford (Unit 2723), observed a white Honda Accord, bearing Texas license plate CWM2579, that was following behind another vehicle in the 26400 block of IH 45 North feeder with the highbeams on. After seeing the actor vehicle fail to dim the highbeam while following another vehicle, I activated my emergency lights and stopped the vehicle in the 26800 block of IH 45 North feeder.

I exited my patrol vehicle and made contact with a White male, identified as Nicholas Gregory Berryman (DOB xxx) from his Texas driver's license. While speaking with Berryman, about the reason that he was stopped I could smell the odor of unburnt marijuana emitting from his open driver's side window. After noticing the smell, I asked Nicholas to exit the vehicle and stand at the front of my patrol vehicle. I asked Nicholas if he had any marijuana in the vehicle and he stated that he did and that it was in the glovebox. I went to the glovebox and located a glass jar containing a very small amount of unburnt marijuana. I also found two multi-colored marijuana pipes and a red marijuana grinder that were also in the glovebox. I continued looking through the vehicle and located a Bob Marley marijuana grinder along with an elephant shaped pipe in the trunk. All the pipes that were found had marijuana debris inside the pipes.

Upon locating all of the drug paraphernalia, I returned my patrol vehicle and issued Nicholas citation 805722 for fail to dim headlights - following, and possession of drug paraphernalia. After writing the citation, I completed a destruction affidavit and had Nicholas sign it along with his citation. The paraphernalia was placed into a plastic bag and Nicholas smashed the pipes in front of my patrol vehicle. The small amount of marijuana that was found was thrown on the ground by Nicholas and destroyed with the bottom of his tennis shoes.

After completing the traffic stop with Nicholas, I returned to the Oak Ridge North PD office with the plastic bag that contained the smashed pipes and threw it into the dumpster.

On 06/11/16 at approximately 2053 hours I, Officer Kennerly, observed a Silver Nissan Maxima, bearing Texas license plate number GGN6598, run a stop sign, at Woodson/Patsy, traveling westbound. I was traveling eastbound and had to turn around. I stopped the vehicle at Woodson/IH 45 North Feeder, in the MY Fit Foods parking lot. I approached the vehicle and identified myself and told the driver, later identified as, Eddie Welch, Texas Driver's license number xxx, why I stopped him. I asked for driver's license and insurance and Welch advised he had no insurance, but gave me his driver's license. At that time, I observed Welch talking slow, but not slurred, as if he were tired. I went back to my vehicle and checked him for warrants on my mobile data computer, and he was clear. After writing a couple of citations, I went back to his vehicle and asked him where he was headed. He advised to get his kids something to eat. He had three children in the vehicle with him, two of them were his kids, a son and daughter and the other was his nephew. His daughter, identified as, Kennedy x, black female, date of birth x (13 yoa), was in the front passenger seat. His son, identified as, Kyren x, black male, date of birth xxx (12 yoa), was sitting in the back passenger seat and his nephew, identified as, Detavius xxx, black male, date of birth xx (11 yoa), was sitting in the back seat, behind the driver. When he was talking to me about getting the kids something to eat, I observed a slurred speech and he was still talking slow. I asked Welch if he had been drinking and he said maybe a little bit.

Welch advised he got a pint after he got off work. He would not tell me what type of an alcoholic beverage it was though. He said it was around 1800 hours, when he got the pint. It is unknown how much of the pint he drank though, I asked him but he wouldn't advise. I asked him to step out of the vehicle and asked him if I could perform some standardized field sobriety test on him. He advised yes.

Upon administering this test I observed the following clues of intoxication:

- * Lack of smooth pursuit (Both left & right eye).
- * Distinct and Sustained Nystagmus at maximum deviation (Both left & right eye).
- * Onset Nystagmus prior to 45 degrees (Both left & right eye).

Note: There were a total of six clues observed in this test, I observed Nystagmus in both the left and the right eye during all of the above steps. During the above mentioned test there could only be a total of six clues that could be possible. Prior to the traffic stop, the battery on my body mic went dead and had to be charged. I did not notice that until after the HGN test was performed. The other test will have audio.

I then provided instructions and demonstrated to him how to perform the Walk & Turn Test. The testing area was flat, partially wet due to it just starting to rain, and clean of any major debris. This test is a divided attention Standardized Field Sobriety Test. Upon him conducting this test, I observed the following clues of intoxication:

- * Can't keep balance.
- * Steps off line.
- * Uses arms to balance.
- * Stops walking
- * Starts too soon
- * Misses heel to toe.

- * Wrong Number of Steps

- * Improper Turn

Note: There were seven clues observed out a total number of eight clues that could be possible.

I demonstrated and explained this test in its entirety making sure that Welch had no further questions prior to beginning. I advised him that he was not to stop once he began or until he felt that he was completely through with the test. Once he began the test I witnessed him to take nine steps in the forward advancement making an improper turn to the right. While walking the initial nine steps of the instructed nine steps process I witnessed him miss heel to toe, extend his arms more than 6" from his side using them for balance, stop while walking and step off of the line not being able to balance while walking. Once he completed the turn to the right, I witnessed him return to the area in which he began the test, taking nine steps to get there out of the initially instructed nine. Once again on the return portion of this test I witnessed him miss heel to toe. Note: As I demonstrated the test to him, he stepped out of the start position several times to keep from falling or to assist in maintaining his balance.

I then provided instructions and demonstrated to him how to perform the One Leg Stand Test. This test is a divided attention Standardized Field Sobriety Test. Upon him conducting this test, I observed the following clues of intoxication:

- * Sways while balancing.

- * Puts foot down.

- * Uses arms to balance.

Note: There were three clues observed out of a total number of four clues that could be possible.

I demonstrated and explained this test in its entirety making sure that Welch had no further questions prior to beginning. I advised him that he was not to

stop once he began or until I told him he was through with the test. I advised him that the test which he was about to perform was a timed test and took exactly 30 seconds to complete. I advised him that once he began the test I would start the clock advising him when 30 seconds had lapsed. Once he began the test I witnessed him lift his foot off of the ground as instructed beginning the test. Welch was swaying while balancing, putting his foot down several times, and using his arms to balance.

Due to Welch not passing any of the Field Sobriety Test, he was placed in custody for driving while intoxicated with child. Welch's wife, identified as, Latisha Thompson, Texas driver's license number 1xxx, came and picked up the children and the vehicle. I read Welch his miranda warning and the copy of the DIC 24 paperwork. Welch gave consent to give blood. I transported him to Memorial Hermann and Registered Nurse, Carl Knies, also asked for Welch's consent before he drew blood. Blood was drawn at 2222 hours. The blood draw kit was packaged and placed in the Oak Ridge North evidence locker. A copy of the DIC 23, 24, and 25 were given to Welch. Oak Ridge North Officer Helton transported Welch to South County Jail to be booked in. Welch was also issued citation number 962469, for Ran Stop Sign @ Intersection and Fail To Maintain Financial Responsibility.

On 06/13/2016 0715 hours, I, Officer H. Richard, was advised by ORNPD answering service of a Burglary of a vehicle call at 27285 Wells Ln. I arrived at 0720 hours and met with the reportee, identified by TX DL# xxx as Collette, Daylene Suzann W/F DOB xxx. She advised that her husband's brown 2013 Ford King Ranch four door pick-up truck TXLP # CWX1126, was broken into between 2230 hours on 06/12/2016 and 0700 hours on 06/13/2016. She advised that the truck was unlocked at the time of the burglary. Prior to our arrival her husband left with the truck. Mrs. Collette advised that her husband noticed that his truck was broken when he went outside at approximately 0700 hours. She also indicated that about \$10.00 in change was missing from the center console. Also the suspects went through the glove box. Mrs. Collette advised they do have surveillance video but she was unable to view the video at this time. She will contact the Oak Ridge North P.D. if there is

video of the suspects. At this time the suspect of the offense is unknown. There was nothing of evidentiary value left on scene.

There were also burglary of a vehicle reports taken at 27281 Wells Lane and 27277 Wells Lane. See report #'s 16P002805 and 16P002806.

On 6/13/2016 at 0720 hours, I, Officer H. Richard, was at 27285 Wells Ln, in reference to a burglary of a vehicle call. While on the call, I met two neighbors who stated their vehicles were also burglarized. I met with Wheelock, Carey Lewis W/F DOB xxx, who lives at 27281 Wells Ln. Her vehicle was also burglarized between 2230 hours on 06/12/2016 and 0700 hours on 06/13/2016. She said that her vehicle was unlocked at the time of the Burglary. Her vehicle is a 2014 gray Hyundai, Texas License plate# DWR8582. The suspects went through the glove box and center console. She noticed the only thing missing from her vehicle was a cell phone charger. Wheelock advised that she did not want to pursue the burglary further at this time. There was nothing of evidentiary value left at the scene. The suspect in the offense is unknown.

There were also burglary of a vehicle reports taken at 27285 Wells Lane and 27277 Wells Lane. See report #'s 16P002804 and 16P002805.

On 06/13/16 at approximately 0720 hours, I, Officer H. Richard, was at 27285 Wells Lane in reference to a burglary of a vehicle call. While on the call, I met two neighbors who stated their vehicles were also burglarized. I met with Gustavo Garza W/M DOB xxx. He resides at 27277 Wells Lane, and indicated that two of his vehicles were broken into. He advised the offense also occurred between 2230 hours on 06/12/2016 and 0700 hours on 06/13/2016. One vehicle was a 2012 grey Nissan Armada 4 door SUV, displaying TXLP# CMC6904. The other vehicle was a 2013 Black Volkswagen Jetta 4 door, displaying TX LP# DTR7862. He advised the vehicles were unlocked at the time of the offense. He advised the suspect entered the vehicles and rummaged through the center consoles and glove boxes. He did not see anything of value missing from the vehicles.

Officer Teske located latent prints on the driver door of the grey Nissan Armada. He lifted prints from the edge of the driver door on a piece of black plastic trim next to the door. The print on the piece of trim was approximately six inches from the bottom of where the trim starts.

Officer Teske located a second latent print on the driver door handle of the Nissan Armada.

Two latent print cards were marked and tagged and placed into evidence at the ORNPD.
