

## **Inflatables Operating Instructions**

Do not operate inflatables in windy or unfavorable weather conditions—they can turn over in high winds and severely injure occupants. Inflatables must be staked.

Make sure that the inflatable is fully inflated before occupants enter. Never allow occupants to enter a partially inflated unit. Occupants must remove shoes and empty their pockets of any objects that could injure themselves or others while jumping.

All eyewear and all jewelry must be removed.

## **RULES FOR SAFETY**

- A. No flips
- B. No rough play or climbing the net walls
- C. No shoes
- D. No sharp objects in or around the inflatable
- E. There must be a supervisor at all times
- F. No food, drink, or gum in and around the inflatable
- G. No eyeglasses or jewelry including watches, bracelets, necklaces, etc.
- H. No silly string in or around the inflatable
- I. Children of the same age group must play in the inflatable at the same time
- J. Do not exceed the recommended capacity!

Occupants should all be of the same age group and should be limited to the maximum number below. Never allow more than the capacity shown. The unit must be supervised by a competent adult at all times.

In the event of severe weather, all occupants must vacate the unit. Unplug the unit immediately. Make sure it remains securely anchored. Do not re-inflate until adverse weather conditions cease. When conditions permit, inflate unit and allow it to dry before using again. Never allow playing on a wet unit. If the inflatable becomes unplugged or loses power during operation, the supervisor should hold the doors open and allow riders to exit.

## TAKE DOWN

Unplug from the power source and remove the blower. Open Velcro flap and zipper to allow air to escape. Do not remove the ties and anchors until all of the air has left the unit. When the unit is flat (Fig 1) remove the ties.

Make two large folds from the sides, bringing the outer sides to the middle and leaving a gap in the center about 1 foot wide (Fig 2), then fold the unit in half (Fig 3). Make sure the blower tube is extended and the zipper is fully open so all remaining air leaves the unit.

When rolling from the front to back, try to get it as small as possible. Carefully "walking" the unit from the front to back can help get excess air out (only during steps 2 and 3). When you have finished rolling the unit, tie the bundle with the strap. Remove all anchors and ties, leaving them with the inflatable for pick up (if applicable).
