
THE LORD'S PRAYER

MUSIC IN WORSHIP

Instead of speaking the Apostle's Creed, this morning we sing it, using the tune GENEVAN 42. The French Reformer John Calvin (1509 - 1564) encouraged the composition and singing of metrical settings of the psalms. Calvin's own congregation in Strasbourg also sang a metrical version of the Apostle's Creed. For the 2009 commemoration of the 500th anniversary of Calvin's birth, David Gambrell wrote this paraphrase of the creed and set it to a melody Calvin likely knew – Psalm 42 from the 1552 *Genevan Psalter*, best known today as the tune for "Comfort, Comfort, Ye My People." David Gambrell is Associate for Worship in the Presbyterian Church Office of Theology and Worship. He is co-editor of the 2018 *Book of Common Worship*, and has written numerous hymns.

We were originally planning to sing today's final hymn, "Your Voice Can Sing," on Sunday, March 22, 2020 – the day we were scheduled to return to the sanctuary to celebrate our new Fisk pipe organ, cross and expanded chancel. The act of singing together is among the most powerfully sacramental acts of the church. Even though right now we sing at home gathered around our computer, we are still the body of Christ. The text was written by Mennonite Adam Tice (born 1979), who lives in Goshen, Indiana.
