



MUSIC IN WORSHIP

Today's final hymn, "God, Whose Giving Knows No Ending," was written by Robert Edwards for a hymn contest on the theme of stewardship. Edwards claim he wrote the hymn while vacationing in the White Mountains of New Hampshire during the summer. The hymn was first published in *Ten New Stewardship Hymns*, 1961. Edwards was educated at Princeton University, Harvard Divinity School, and Union Theological Seminary, New York. He was ordained to the United Church of Christ and served churches in Connecticut throughout his career.

We appreciate the vocal contributions of Doug Johnson, Baritone, this morning. Doug received his bachelor's and master's degree in music from Butler University, and now directs the choral department at Earlham College in Richmond, Indiana. He recently began duties as director of the Westminster Presbyterian Virtual Quartet, based in Munster, Indiana. He is also the founder and artistic director of Indianapolis' own Circle City Chamber Choir. Doug served as Northminster Presbyterian Church's Interim Choral Director during John Wright's sabbatical, fall of 2018. We are fortunate to have Doug Johnson as one of Northminster's Section Leaders.
