



#### **MUSIC IN WORSHIP**

We sing today's final hymn, "You Walk along Our Shoreline," as a response to Mark's gospel lesson in which Jesus calls ordinary people to leave behind everything and follow him. The hymn's text was written by Sylvia Dunstan in 1984 after reading an article in which fishing was used as a metaphor for ministry. She drew upon stories from three Gospels to speak of Jesus' invitation to the disciples that they become fishers of a different type. A Canadian, Dunstan (1955 – 1993) enjoyed a varied career, serving as minister of the United Church of Canada, a prison chaplain and editor of the Canadian worship resource journal, *Gathering*. Several of her hymns have been published by various denominations.

Whether you have been part of this "book group" from its beginning, or would now like to get involved, join us as we read and discuss and learn. Parish Associate Carol McDonald will be joined by Northminster members in guiding the conversations.

Sunday, February 21 – 5:30 p.m. Evicted: Poverty and Profit in the American City by Matthew Desmond.

Desmond follows 8 families in Milwaukee as they struggle to keep roofs over their heads. This book will transform our understanding of poverty and economic exploitation while providing fresh ideas for confronting one of 21<sup>st</sup> century America's most devastating problems. Its unforgettable scenes of hope and loss remind us of the centrality of home, without which nothing else is possible.

Sunday, March 21 – 5:30 p.m. Caste: The Origins of Our Discontents by Isabel Wilkerson. Wilkerson gives us a masterful portrait of an unseen phenomenon in America: how America today and throughout its history has been shaped by a hidden caste system, a rigid hierarchy of human rankings. She explores 8 pillars that underlie caste systems across civilizations, including divine will, bloodlines, and stigma. And she points forward to ways America can move beyond the artificial and destructive separations of human divisions, toward hope in our common humanity.
