
* DECLARATION OF FORGIVENESS



MUSIC IN WORSHIP

In Psalm 4 we are reminded God hears and answers our prayers. In the opening lines, the psalmist gets right to the point: "Hear when I pray." The writer speaks of his suffering ("Long have I suffered revilement and shame") but is confident the Lord will provide peace ("I know there will be justice according to holy decree."). As the psalm approaches the end, the mood changes and the psalmist is assured of God's presence ("Safely I rest in the palm of your hand."). The one who was desperate can now be at peace, for matters can be left in God's hands.
