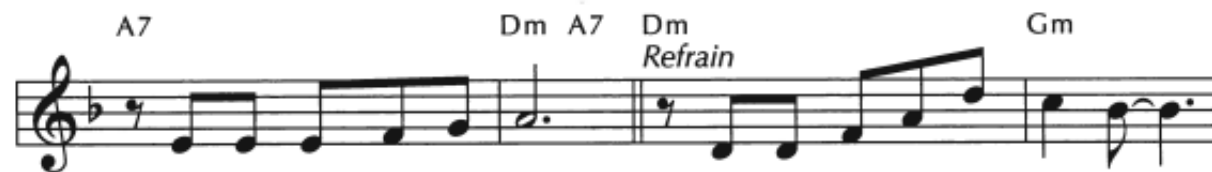

MUSIC IN WORSHIP

Today's opening Hymn No. 1, "Holy, Holy, Holy! Lord God Almighty!" was written by Reginald Heber specifically to be sung after the Nicene Creed on Trinity Sunday. The hymn draws on passages from Revelation 4 and Isaiah 6, our Old Testament lesson, in which Isaiah has a vision of God and receives his commission. Despite the irregular accents, the uneven number of syllables in various lines, and the limited rhyme scheme (rhyming on the "EE" vowel), the hymn continues to speak to generations of worshippers.

As part of our Invitation to Communion, we sing the hymn “Feed Us, Lord,” by Greg Scheer. This brief hymn consists of a series of prayerful petitions. The first stanza alludes to the experience of two disciples who encountered the risen Christ on the road from Jerusalem to Emmaus but did not recognize him until they shared a meal with him. The imagery of the second stanza connects more naturally to the liquid element of the sacrament, but it’s also a recollection of promises of God’s favor in Isaiah 35 and 44. The third stanza calls to mind the meals shared by the risen Christ and the disciples. The final stanza provides an important reminder that the spiritual nourishment received from the Lord’s Supper is intended to sustain us in paths of witness and service. The plural pronouns throughout are a significant expression of the communal nature of this sacramental meal. Author and composer Greg Scheer is one of today’s leading figures in global and contemporary hymns. He serves on the faculty of Calvin College, Grand Rapids, Michigan.
