





IN WORSHIP

Today is World Communion Sunday, the day we remember that we are part of a large family of faith that spans the whole world, who will all be welcomed at the Lord's Table today. We celebrate with Global Worship, which means the prayers, liturgies and songs were chosen specifically because they represent the global voices of our siblings around the world. The country of origin is listed next to each movement of worship.

Karen's stole is from Soeul, Korea. Brian's stole is from Bethlehem, Palestine.

Today's final hymn, "Let Us Talents and Tongues Employ," is a communion hymn that speaks of feeding and being fed. The sharing of the body of Christ is at the center, but the benefits highlighted are unity and empowerment. Sharing the feast of the Lord's Supper affects the broader world; the earth itself "breathes again" as the living Lord is remembered. The author, Fred Kaan, was born in the Netherlands, grew up during the Nazi occupation, and became a pastor in the United Reformed Church of England. LINSTEAD is a Jamaican folk tune, adapted by Doreen Potter. Ms. Potter brought the melody to Kaan and asked him to write a text. Kahn decided on a hymn in celebration of the Lord's Supper, which he referred to as "Communion Calypso."
