





## **GOING FORTH**

Sanctus, sanctus, sanctus Dominus Deus Sabbaoth. Pleni sunt coeli et terra gloria tua. Hosanna in excelsis.

Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of Sabaoth; Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

#### MUSIC IN WORSHIP

The choral response as we are sent forth, "Sanctus," comes from Classical composer Michael Haydn's (1737 – 1806) *Requiem in C minor*. This short movement is rather stately. At the *Hosanna in excelsis* section, where many composers write energetically, Haydn uses a more lyrical and gentle setting. The younger brother of Joseph Haydn, Michael Haydn was born in the Austrian village of Rohrau, near the Hungarian border. In 1763 he moved to Salzburg, where he served, for the rest of his life, as court musician and concert master for the Archbishop of Salzburg, and organist of the Holy Trinity Church. M. Haydn composed mostly sacred music, including 38 masses, 6 Te Deums and 3 Requiems, the C minor being his first. It is commonly believed that Mozart patterned his famous *Requiem* after Haydn's *Requiem in C minor*, which Mozart would have heard as a teenager. Our Chancel Choir and orchestra will perform the entire work at 4pm Sunday, March 22, as part of Northminster's arts series, *Sound & Spirit*.
