Lord, lead us to shelter the homeless and the immigrant in your love.


From death of dreams of the elders and death of vision of Youth,



Music and Art in Worship

As part of the Invitation to Communion, the Chancel Choir sings American composer Karen Marrolli's "The Stranger's Guise." Commissioned by Northminster Presbyterian Church and First Presbyterian Church, Lexington, Kentucky, for this summer's Montreat Conference on Worship and Music, the piece is a setting of the medieval text *Celtic Rune of Hospitality*. Conductor and composer Karen Marrolli is currently the Director of Music Ministries at Central United Methodist Church in Albuquerque, New Mexico. She holds a DMA degree in Choral Conducting from Louisiana State University, a Masters degree in Choral Conducting and Sacred Music from Westminster Choir College and a Bachelor's degree in Theory and Composition from Westminster.

Today we pray the Lord's Prayer through song. Our soloist, Krista Wright, sings an Arabic version – "Abana alathi fi ssama." Singing familiar Biblical texts of another community expresses much more than the desire to be multicultural. It reflects Christ's incarnational presence in various cultures and worship experiences. When we adopt the language of another culture's worship, we are simply singing the redemptive work of the Spirit that is undeniably common to all of Christ's church. Composer and author Greg Scheer arranged this version from the Egyptian folk style. Based in Grand Rapids, Michigan, Scheer is one of today's leading figures in global and contemporary hymns, and currently serves as director of worship at Church of the Servant and Music Associate at the Calvin Institute of Christian Worship. The accompanying instrument is a harmonium, which in this particular setting, produces a drone sound. A harmonium is a small pump or reed organ that reached its apex of popularity in the late 1800s. Its volume and tonal range is limited, with pedal boards being rare. The instrument is still quite popular in India

The hands banner was made approximately 10 years ago using a sun print dying technique learned at Montreat. The hand outlines are from Northminster members of all ages. Mary Boris designed and created this banner. The rainbow streamers against the back wall were used at Montreat in 2012 during the Worship and Music Conference and were purchased by Northminster following the conference. The papercut suncatchers lining the ramp to the sanctuary were made by congregation members at a Wednesday evening art class led by Lisa Longo. They are stars and hearts to celebrate World Communion Sunday representing God's love around the globe and that we all live under the same stars. John and Cheryl Plunkett hand crafted several of the loaves of bread for the Communion Table today.
