Music in Worship

The sung response to the Declaration of Forgiveness, Hymn No. 582 "Glory to God, Whose Goodness Shines on Me," has become a favorite of Northminster parishioners. This setting of the Gloria Patri (Glory to the Father) was first introduced to us when we were one of the "Hymnal experiment churches" in the early stages of the formation of our 2013 hymnal, *Glory to God*. The Gloria Patri is an ancient response to the promise of God's mercy and reconciliation and is sung by most reformed churches each Service for the Lord's Day. The composer of this setting, Paul Vasile (born 1984), serves as the Executive Director of "Music that Makes Community" in Washington, D.C.

Today's Offertory, "Hymn of Praise," was written in 1984 for the Trinity United Methodist Choir, Hutchinson, Kansas, by American educator, conductor, and composer Reneé Clausen. The piece, written in ABA form, is a paraphrase of Psalms 90 and 150. Even though the piece is only 4 minutes in length, it contains 7 sections, which move seamlessly from one transition to the next. Reneé Clausen recently retired as the conductor of the Concordia Choir, Moorhead, Minnesota, a position he has held since 1986. He is the artistic director of the Emmy Award-winning *Concordia Christmas Concerts*, which are frequently featured by PBS stations throughout the nation.

American composer and arranger Marty Haugen (born 1950) wrote our final hymn, No. 301 "Let us Build a House," for a church dedication. Although the five stanzas use the imagery of construction, the real emphasis is not on a physical structure but a spiritual one. The essential frame of reference is those who inhabit this place, affirming the vital distinction that the church is not the building but the people. Of the hymn, Haugen has stated he wanted to write a text "that reflects the welcome to table fellowship that Jesus offered unconditionally to everyone." The tune name, TWIN OAKS, refers to two large oaks that frames Haugen's uncle and aunt's house in Michigan, which is where Haugen was when he composed it. Mary Haugen was raised in the American Lutheran Church, received a BA in psychology from Luther College, yet has worked for the Roman Catholic Church for most of his life. He is currently the composer in residence at Mayflower Community Congregational Church, Minneapolis, Minnesota. Over 400 of Haugen's compositions are published.
