Forgive us, O God. Restore in us, yet again, the commitment to be more Christ-like in word, in deed and in spirit.



#### Music in Worship

Johann Sebastian Bach (1685 – 1750) composed Cantata 190 Singet dem Herrn ein neues Lied (Sing a new song to the Lord) for a New Year's Day celebration 1724 in the church in which he served as music director, St. Thomas, Leipzig, Germany. The text of the work celebrates the start of the new year and contains hopes for God's blessings for a new beginning. This morning we offer the work as we prepare to begin a new liturgical year, which begins next Sunday, the first Sunday of Advent.

In addition to the usual cantata scoring of strings and four-part choir and soloists, Bach calls on three trumpets, timpani and a woodwind quartet consisting of three oboes and bassoon. The congregation at St. Thomas, Leipzig, must have been surprised and overwhelmed by the opening chorus, which displays much fanfare and flourish. Such grandiose music for the New Year surely had never been heard in Leipzig before. In the first movement, the central text, "All that has breath, praise the Lord," is treated twice as a fugue. This section is offset from the outer sections by two grand unison statements of Martin Luther's setting of the Te Deum: "Lord God, we praise you" and "Lord God, we thank you." No. 2 introduces the three soloists (Bass, Tenor and Alto), as they make personal petitions for their land and city. The chorus sings four homophonic phrases (all voices moving at the same time) of the aforementioned Luther Te Deum text. No. 3 is one of two arias in the cantata, this one set for Alto and strings. Set as an elegant dance, the Alto reiterates the exhortation of praise - "Praise Zion your God, praise your God with joy." In No. 4 Recitative, the Bass soloist seeks God's guidance in the new year. The following aria, No. 5, is a beautiful duet for Tenor and Bass, with oboe d'amore playing a sweet countermelody throughout. Primarily used in Baroque music, the oboe d'amore is pitched a minor 3<sup>rd</sup> lower than the usual oboe and its bell is shaped like an apple, producing a tranquil and serene tone. The singers speak of Jesus as the object of their praise - "Jesus shall remain my beginning." No. 6 Recitative is a prayer for the New Year, asking for blessings on the church, the school, the teachers, city leaders, and each house. As is the custom with Bach cantatas, the work closes with a chorale, a particularly rousing one (note the timpani and trumpet flourishes). Bach uses the same instrumentation as the opening Chorus and the chorale is an exhortation to resolve that praise would continue throughout the New Year, so that the year would end as it began, with praise to God.

#### **SOLOISTS**

Bass Samuel Spade has appeared as soloist in several Bach cantatas, Haydn's *Die Schöpfung*, Mendelssohn's *Elijah*, Orff's *Carmina Burana*, Brahms' *Ein Deutsches Requiem*, Vaughan Williams' *Five Mystical Songs* and *Dona Nobis Pacem*. Originally from Des Moines, Iowa, he received bachelor's and master's degrees in Vocal Performance from I. U. Jacobs School of Music.

**Tenor Conner McWhirter** recently sang the role of The Duke of Mantua in Verdi's *Rigoletto*. Upcoming performances include Torero in Golijov's *Ainadamar*. Originally from Orlando, Florida, he attended the Eastman School of Music and Southern Methodist University and is currently a Performance Diploma student at I. U. Jacobs School of Music.

**Mezzo-Soprano Emily Warren** recently performed the role of Aloèes in Chabrier's *L'étoile*. Other roles include Sesto in Handel's *Giulio Cesare*, Dryade in Strauss's *Aridne auf Naxos*, and Dritte Dame in Mozart's *Die Zauberflote*. She received the master's degree and Performer's Diploma at I. U. Jacobs School of Music and is currently a first-year doctoral student there.
