

MUSIC IN WORSHIP

Our opening hymn, No. 19, "God of Great and God of Small," reminds us of Jesus' teaching that being childlike is a characteristic of those who wish to live under God's reign. The stanzas, addressed to God and not about God, lists pairs and opposites as part of God's creation and concern. The hymn writer, Natalie Sleeth (1930 – 1992), was an Illinois native. She received a BA degree in music theory from Wellesley College in 1952 and received honorary doctorates from two colleges - West Virginia Wesleyan College in 1959 and Nebraska Wesleyan College in 1990. Sleeth wrote organ works, hymns and anthems. Her most popular hymn is No. 250 "Hymn of Promise."

Today's Offertory, "O for a closer walk with God," was composed by Sir Charles Villiers Stanford (1852 – 1924). The piece is a setting of the hymn CAITHNESS, which first appeared in the 1635 Scottish Psalter. Written for organ and SATB choir, the sopranos make the opening statement and then are joined by the lower three voices. The mood of the music reflects the tender poem by William Cowper (1731 – 1800). Stanford, along with Elgar and Parry, brought about the so-called "English Musical Renaissance" a rebirth of internationally significant compositions in Great Britain at the beginning of the 20th century. Stanford was an influential teacher (Ralph Vaughan Williams and Herbert Howells were two notable students) and composer of mainly sacred choral and organ works.




