
#### \*DECLARATION OF FORGIVENESS





# Be Thou My Vision









These stanzas are selected from a 20th-century English poetic version of an Irish monastic prayer dating to the 10th century or before. They are set to an Irish folk melody that has proved popular and easily sung despite its lack of repetition and its wide range.

The opening phrase here (based on 1 Timothy 6:12) is not a military image but an athletic one, from a Greek verb meaning "struggle" or "grapple" or "wrestle." The sports context continues in later stanzas reflecting the experience of a runner (recalling Hebrews 12:1–2).

## **MUSIC IN WORSHIP**

Today's Offertory, "Fight the Good Fight," echoes our Epistle lesson (Philippians 4: 3b-14). The text writer, Irish Anglican priest John Monsell (1811-1875), was a prolific hymnist, writing 11 published volumes of poetry and around 300 hymn texts. The text is set for homophonic (all voices moving at the same time) choir and organ. The organ plays fanfare-like chords and rhythms as the choir sings something seemingly unrelated. At "Cast care aside," the rhythmic treatment changes, then reappears at "Faint not, nor fear..." The composer, John Gardner (1917-2011), wrote 250 works, including 3 symphonies and 6 operas. Born in Manchester, England, he is most famous for his 1967 choral-organ setting of the Christmas carol "Tomorrow Shall Be My Dancing Day."






