


WE RESPOND TO GOD'S WORD



MUSIC IN WORSHIP

This morning's offertory is the 6th movement of John Rutter's (born 1949) 7 movement work for chorus and orchestra, *Requiem*. "The Lord is My Shepherd" is a tender and pastoral version of Psalm 23, weaving a plaintive oboe throughout. Rutter originally wrote this piece in 1976 as an anthem and incorporated it into his setting of the Requiem mass in 1985.

Our final hymn, "Now Rejoice, Rejoice Beloved," is a 2015 paraphrase, by David Gambrell, of today's Epistle lesson, Philippians 4: 1 – 9. The hymn (and scripture lesson) is unique in its double invitation to "rejoice." Gambrell chose the hymn tune MERTON, composed by London musician William Monk (1823 – 1899), to accompany the text. A Louisiana native, David Gambrell currently serves as Associate for Worship in the PCUSA Office of Theology of Worship and Co-Editor of the 2018 Book of Common Worship.

We welcome oboist Leonid Sirotkin and appreciate his engagement with worship today. He is Principal Oboe in the Indianapolis Chamber Orchestra and a member of the Fort Wayne Philharmonic and Des Moines Metro Opera Orchestra. A native of St. Petersburg, Russia, Mr. Sirotkin served for almost a decade as principal English horn with the Kirov Opera and Symphony Orchestra of the Mariinsky Theater. In the United States, he has performed with the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra, Iowa Opera, Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra, and Colorado Springs Philharmonic. Mr. Sirotkin teaches oboe at DePauw University and Anderson University and is active as a private instructor and chamber music coach. In 2010, he was featured on the American Public Media radio program "Performance Today". He is also a published author, completing 2000 Orchestral Excerpts for Oboe and English Horn from Operas and Ballets by Tchaikovsky. Leonid Sirotkin has played as a soloist and orchestra member several times at Northminster and we are delighted he is back with us today.




