

# 834 Precious Lord, Take My Hand



This black gospel song, like much hymnody, sprang out of the author's deep personal loss (the death of his wife and newborn son), yet it has brought solace to many. He thought his fingers were playing new music, but they unlocked a deep memory of a tune almost a century old.

#### **CHORAL RESPONSE**

"The Road Home" | PROSPECT, arr. Stephen Paulus (1949-2014)

Tell me, where is the road I can call my own, That I left, that I lost, So long ago? All these years I have wandered, Oh, when will I know There's a way, there's a road That will lead me home

After wind, after rain, When the dark is done, As I wake from a dream In the gold of day, Through the air there's a calling From far away, There's a voice I can hear That will lead me home.

Rise up, follow me, Come away is the call, With love in your heart as the only song; There is no such beauty as where you belong, Rise up, follow me, I will lead you home.



#### IN WORSHIP

Today's first hymn, No. 619, "Praise My Soul, the God of Heaven," is a paraphrase of Psalm 103 by Scottish hymnist and poet Henry Lyte (1793-1847), who is also the author of the hymn "Abide with Me." In this hymn, we give praise to the everlasting God, who is "slow to chide and swift to bless" (stanza 2). The hymn gives a description of God as a parent, who cares for us and knows us (stanza 3). In the fourth stanza, we ask the angels and saints ("dwellers in all time and space") to join us in this song of praise. John Goss (1800-1880) composed LAUDA ANIMA specifically for Lyte's text in 1869. Goss, the son of an organist, became one of the greatest organists to serve St. Paul's Cathedral in London, England, in the 19th century. He also taught harmony at the Royal Academy of Music for 47 years and was knighted in 1872.

Our final act of worship this morning is the Chancel Choir's prayer "The Road Home," a composition written by American composer Stephen Paulus (1949-2014) after receiving a commission from the Dale Warland Singers in 2011 for a short "folk" type choral arrangement. Paulus chose the tune PROSPECT from The Southern Harmony Songbook of 1835. The melody, which may be found in our hymnal Glory to God, No. 807, "When We Must Beat Persistent Pain," uses the F pentatonic scale. Some of our worshippers may associate this tune with "The Lone Wild Bird." The librettist Michael Dennis Browne has stated, "I was trying to suggest the consolation that can come to someone of faith, in times of great stress, as a result of prayer and an abiding belief in divine mercy."






