



IN WORSHIP

Today's opening hymn, No. 726 "Will You Come and Follow Me," also known as "The Summons," is based on Mark's gospel, and contains thirteen questions asked by Jesus in the first person (stanzas 1 – 4) with the singer responding in stanza 5. "The Summons" of Christ is to a radical Christianity. We are challenged to "leave yourself behind" and to "risk the hostile stare" (stanza two), to "set the prisoner free" and "kiss the leper clean" (stanza three), and to "use the faith you've found to reshape the world around" (stanza four). Set to the Scottish ballad KELVINGROVE, the hymn's arranger and author is John Bell (born 1949). Bell is a Scottish preacher, musician, and leader of the Iona Community in Iona Scotland.

Today's Offertory, "Christus Paradox," was written by Sylvia Dunstan (1955 – 1993), a hymn writer and pastor of the United Church of Canada. In this piece, she powerfully portrays the paradox of Christ being both human and divine. Dunstan piles on the comparisons presenting Christ as both Lamb and Shepherd, prince and slave, gift and cost, someone "we both scorn and crave." The paradox, "You the everlasting instant" is sung five times. American composer, organist and conductor Alfred Fedak uses the hymn tune PICARDY to set Dunstan's text. A hymn version of this anthem may be found in *Glory to God*, page 274, "You, Lord, Are Both Lamb and Shepherd."






