*CALL TO CONFESSION


*PRAYER OF CONFESSION

Forgive us, O God, and lead us back to your waters of transformation.



*DECLARATION OF FORGIVENESS


Beloved, God forgives our sins.

Written for the confirmation of the author's son, this text of self-dedication also voices our recurring individual need to recommit ourselves in less formal ways. The familiar shape note tune enhances a sense of finding our place among God's people from all times and places.

IN WORSHIP

This morning's opening hymn, No. 482 "Baptized in Water," was written by British theologian Michael Saward in 1981. The hymn lists some of the things God does in baptism – cleanses, makes us heirs of salvation, promises, brings death and life in Christ, frees, forgives, and gives new life in the Spirit as God's children. The Gaelic melody, BUNESSAN accompanies the text. Some of our worshippers may recall recording artist Cat Stevens, now known as Yusuf, used this tune in his 1972 recording of the hymn arrangement "Morning Has Broken."

Today's Psalm, Psalm 29, speaks almost exclusively about the mighty acts of God in nature. It begins with a call to give God glory ("Ascribe to the Lord the glory due God's name"). After this introduction, we sense God's power in the awesome sights, sounds and force of a thunderstorm ("The voice of the Lord breaks the cedar trees, shakes the wilderness; bursts forth in lightning flashes; makes the oak tress write and strips the forests bare)." Such displays of divine might may cause Baal worshippers to tremble, but true believers praise their God exuberantly, knowing the Lord of the thunderstorm gives strength to his people and blesses them with peace: "O Lord, give strength to your people; give them...the blessings of peace."
