All: **Forgive us, Lord.**

All: **Lord Jesus Christ, cleanse our lives of all shameful attitudes of mind and heart so that we might better follow you in all we do, and say, and are.**


Friends, the good news of our faith is this:

This well-crafted morning hymn opens by celebrating daylight as an image of Christ, the true Light, then ponders life without light, and culminates in a prayer for inward light. The tune's name honors its German roots: Ratisbon is the former English name for Regensburg.

IN WORSHIP

On this Sunday, we observe the Transfiguration of the Lord. “Transfiguration” refers to a change in form or appearance. At the Transfiguration, we celebrate the revelation of divine glory in the human life of Jesus Christ. Jesus’ radiant appearance on the mountaintop evokes the consuming fire of the glory of the Lord at Mount Sinai. Standing with Moses and Elijah, Jesus represents the fulfillment of the law and baptism, as God again claims him as a “beloved child.” This event also looks forward to his death and resurrection, as the one who is lifted up on the cross will reveal the glorious victory of God.

This morning’s prelude, “Procession of the Gargoyles,” is the opening movement of Thomas H. Kerr’s (1915-1988) eleven-movement organ suite *Suite Sébastienne*. Kerr was an American composer, organist, and teacher who composed and arranged for piano, organ, solo voice, woodwind ensemble, and chorus. He served as Professor of Music and Chair of the keyboard department at Howard University for over 30 years, and served as organist of the Plymouth Congregational United Church of Christ in Washington, DC. As a pianist, he was the first African American to perform a recital at the National Gallery of Art in Washington, DC.

This morning’s Offertory, “Hold Out Your Light,” was arranged by Los Angeles native Albert John McNeil (1920 – 2022), American choral conductor, educator, ethnomusicologist, author, and founder of the Albert McNeil Jubilee Singers. For many years, he was Professor of Music at the University of California – Davis, where he served as Director of Choral Activities. His career was dedicated to upholding the choral music traditions of African American composers.
