



Savior, like a Shepherd Lead Us 187



This unattributed hymn, like many that are now meaningful to adults, was written for children and develops shepherd imagery from Psalm 23 and John 10:1–18. The tune, composed for these words, was originally named for the text but has come to be known by the composer's name.

IN WORSHIP

The anthem "Surrexit pastor bonus" was composed by the Flemish composer Orlando di Lasso (c. 1532-1594). He stands with Palestrina and William Byrd as the three great composers of the late Renaissance. He was appointed Maestro di Cappella at the basilica of St. John Lateran (Rome) in 1551, a position which would be later held by Palestrina. In 1556, he assumed the same position in Munich for the Duke of Bavaria, where he stayed until his death, nearly thirty years later. Orlando di Lasso composed approximately 2000 sacred and secular vocal compositions. Among his sacred works, he is best known for his motets, which often vividly express the texts on which they are composed. "Surrexit pastor bonus" is a five-voice motet celebrating the resurrection. Written for five voices two soprano parts, alto, tenor, and bass - the piece begins with all voices singing an ascending interval on the word "surrexit" (risen). Note the descending passages on "mori dignatus" (deigned to die). At the midway point, the choir sings a series of cascading "Alleluias," a welcome addition to the season of Easter.

As a member of the Covenant Network of Presbyterians, we seek equity for LGBTQIA2S+ people in church and society. We welcome, honor, celebrate, and include all.






