



Where Charity and Love Prevail 316



This English paraphrase is based on a longer Latin hymn traditionally associated with the footwashing ritual on Maundy Thursday, an enactment of Christ's "new commandment" that we should love one another (John 13:34). For a chant setting of the first line of the hymn see no. 205.

IN WORSHIP

Today's offertory was written by British composer Philip Wilby. Wilby (born 1949) has written many different styles of music including works for concerts, church, and television. The piece opens quietly as the sopranos state the main textual idea, "If ye love me, keep my commandments, and I will pray the Father, and He shall give you another Comforter, that He may abide with you forever. The other voices enter, building with organ at "e'en the Spirit of Truth." After a brief organ interlude, the choir sings in unison at "And ye know Him, for He dwelleth with you, and shall be in you. I will not leave you comfortless," before tapering off with the quiet "Amen."

As a member of the Covenant Network of Presbyterians, we seek equity for LGBTQIA2S+ people in church and society. We welcome, honor, celebrate, and include all.






