



We believe God will grant us new insights, fresh resolve, and the peace that passes all understanding.





IN WORSHIP

"Pentecost" comes from a Greek word meaning fiftieth day. On this day, the Holy Spirit came with wind and flame, empowering the disciples to proclaim the good news of the risen Lord to all people. Falling on the fiftieth day of the season of Easter, Pentecost represents the culmination of the church's seven-week celebration of Christ's resurrection. Pentecost is a day of new creation – all things transformed and made new by the Word and Breath of the living God. On this day we give particular thanks for the gift of God's Holy Spirit, who gathers the church as the body of Christ and sends us to share in Christ's mission throughout the world. (from the Book of Common Worship, 2018 Westminster John Knox Press)

In Psalm 104, we join the psalmist in praising God for the splendor of creation. We sing of God's Spirit breathing life upon all creatures, not human beings alone. The psalm makes known that the world is well ordered and reliable, but on its own, it has no possibility of survival or well-being. All of that is a daily gift from Yahweh. With this awareness, the psalmist states, in verse 34: "I will sing to the Lord my whole lifelong; I will sing praise to God as long as I live."

Today's final hymn, "God of Tempest, God of Whirlwind," was first published in 2000. Although the author, Herman Stuempfle, does not mention "Spirit" until midway through the second stanza, "Pentecost" is named at the beginning and the connection is clear. Powerful images appear throughout the hymn – tempest and whirlwind, blazing and burning, earthquake and thunder, and passion without sleep. The petitions are equally powerful: drive us to costly service, let your flaming Spirit surge and kindle truth against the deceit of injustice, break chains of sin and walls that divide, and stir in us a restlessness that is not content with evil." Herman Stuempfle (1934 – 2017) served as president of Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg from 1976 to 1989. He was a poet, preacher and professor, and life-long Lutheran who authored several books on preaching and theology. He also wrote numerous hymn texts.
