we have died to the old life, and a new life has begun.



IN WORSHIP

The anthem "O Clap Your Hands," is a 1973 setting of Psalm 47: 1-7 by the English composer John Rutter (born 1945). Rutter sets the Psalm in an exuberant manner for a four-part chorus, providing a flamboyant part for the organ. At "O sing praises unto our God," the tempo broadens, followed by a brief a cappella section – "Sing ye praises with understanding." The material from the opening reappears at the beginning of the final section - "O clap your hands together all ye people" – and proceeds to the final climax with several meter changes, employing a particularly exciting flourish for the organ. Rutter also composed a version for chorus and orchestra.

Today's Offertory, "O for a Closer Walk With God," was composed by Sir Charles Villiers Stanford (1852 – 1924). The piece is a setting of the hymn CAITHNESS, which first appeared in the 1635 Scottish Psalter. Written for the organ and SATB choir, the sopranos make the opening statement and then are joined by the lower three voices. The mood of the music reflects the tender poem by William Cowper (1731 – 1800). Stanford, along with Elgar and Parry, brought about the so-called "English Musical Renaissance," a rebirth of internationally significant compositions in Great Britain at the beginning of the 20th century. He was an influential teacher (Ralph Vaughan Williams and Herbert Howells were two notable students) and composer of mainly sacred choral and organ works.

As a member of the Covenant Network of Presbyterians, we seek equity for LGBTQIA2S+ people in church and society. We welcome, honor, celebrate, and include all.




