Friends, through Christ, God has poured out the Holy Spirit upon us for the forgiveness of sins.





IN WORSHIP

"Pentecost" comes from a Greek word meaning fiftieth day. On this day, the Holy Spirit came with wind and flame, empowering the disciples to proclaim the good news of the risen Lord to all people. Falling on the fiftieth day of the season of Easter, Pentecost represents the culmination of the church's seven-week celebration of Christ's resurrection. Pentecost is a day of new creation – all things transformed and made new by the Word and Breath of the living God. On this day we give particular thanks for the gift of God's Holy Spirit, who gathers the church as the body of Christ and sends us to share in Christ's mission throughout the world. The African American spiritual "Every Time I Feel the Spirit," arranged by William Dawson (1899 - 1990) and sung by the Chancel Choir, was first published in 1874. Originally, the song would have been sung by the enslaved (without printed music) while working in the fields, as a prayer at night, or during a secret worship service. The first two syllables, "Ev - ry," have fermatas over them, which captures the listener's attention immediately. The piece moves forward in a brisk tempo with the opening refrain. Dawson sets two verses for the soloist as the choir hums underneath. When the refrain returns after the first solo line, the choir sings an unexpected piano dynamic with slightly altered harmonies. As the piece moves toward the finale, the basses sing a rapid eighthnote counter-melody while the upper three voices sing the refrain. William Dawson was a composer, conductor, and professor revered for his contribution to American choral music. Although he is best known for his arrangements of African American spirituals, he also composed chamber music and orchestral music, including his 1934 Negro Folk Symphony. Born in Anniston, Alabama, Dawson ran away from home at the age of 13 to attend the Tuskegee Institute where he sang in the choir and played trombone. After completing his education at Tuskegee, he became the Director of Music at Lincoln High School, Kansas City, He continued his education in Kansas City at the Horner Institute of Fine Arts where he convinced the then all-white school to allow him to earn his BA through one-on-one tutoring sessions. After completion, he received a Master of Music degree from the American Conservatory of Music. In 1930 Dawson returned to Tuskegee as a faculty member, founding the Music School and developing the Tuskegee Institute Choir into a world-renowned touring ensemble. Dawson's spiritual arrangements are still regularly performed by high school, college, church, community, and professional choirs around the world.


