

It seems odd now to think of singing this text to ADESTE FIDELES, but mainline churches did so well into the 20th century because of a cultural bias against shape note music. The vigor of the present tune seems especially right for the final line's reference to Hebrews 13:5.

IN WORSHIP


Today's first hymn, No. 22 "God of the Sparrow," was written by Jaroslav Vajda in 1983 at the request of Concordia Lutheran Church, Kirkwood, Missouri, in celebration of their 110th anniversary. Vajda claims he regarded the invitation as "an opportunity to compose a hymn text exploring why and how God's creations (and children) are to serve him." The text is interesting in that there is no punctuation and there are twelve rhetorical questions. The composer of the hymn's music, Carl Schalk, has stated, "stanza 1 addresses God in nature's more beneficent aspects; stanza 2 addresses God in nature's more ominous dimensions; stanza 3 addresses God in the heart of the Gospel (rainbow, cross, empty grave, grace); stanzas 4 and 5 address God in the social and horizontal dimensions of the Gospel (hungry, sick, prodigal, neighbor); and the final stanza sums it all up (God of the ages and near at hand). The hymn is a good example of why one cannot pick and choose stanzas randomly. They make a complete whole."

This morning's final hymn, No. 463 "How Firm a Foundation," is one of the most popular hymns in the United States. The first stanza speaks of the foundation of Christian life as being rooted in God's Word. The subsequent stanzas are paraphrases from both the Old and New Testaments. As we sing the hymn, we are assured that when we face difficulties and dangers, as we know we must, we are not alone but supported by One whose strength will enable us to bear whatever is demanded.
