





This text reflects the historic understanding of Lent as a time to prepare catechumens for Baptism and penitents for reconciliation at the Easter Vigil. The first three stanzas address one of the three divine Persons, while the fourth stanza implores the help of the full Trinity.

IN WORSHIP

This morning's Psalm – Psalm 77: 1-2, 11-20 presents two different themes. First, in verses 1-2, the psalmist makes clear that they have been trying without success to make contact with God during the day, and in the night the pain is more intense. The psalmist's hands are stretched out in prayer, like a person drowning, reaching for help ("by night my hands were spread out in prayer without ceasing, my soul refused all comfort"). The mood changes at verse 11. The writer's attention turns to the mighty acts of God in the past – "But then I remember what the Lord has done and call to mind the wonders of old." Verses 14 and 15 recall God's deliverance of the people in the events of the exodus (Exodus 19-20). When God appeared at that time, it was an act of deliverance of the Israelites from the power of the Egyptians. Nature was involved as well. The language is poetic, personalizing powers of nature: the waters saw God, were afraid, and trembled. A mighty storm rose, with lightning, thunder, and high winds. God leading Israel out of Egypt is pictured as a shepherd leading a flock ("You led your people like sheep"). The path went right through the sea with God as the leader, yet no footprints could be seen ("Your path was in the sea... and your footprints were not seen").

The subject of today's Offertory, "Prayer of St. Gregory," is St. Gregory the Illuminator, who brought Christianity to Armenia in the early 4th century. The composer, Alan Hovhaness (1911-2000), called it "a prayer in darkness," and depicts Gregory's prayers from prison, where he spent 12 years. The piece begins with organ alone softly, then trumpet enters in the same manner, playing expressive slow phrases. As Gregory begins to pray fervently, the trumpet plays a more forte dynamic. The melody ascends and crescendos. Several measures later, the trumpet re-enters and wanes in energy, with notes moving in a descending motion with softer dynamics as if Gregory's prayers fade around the prison walls. Alan Hovhaness was one of the most prolific composers of the 20th century. Composing over 500 works, he wrote symphonies, choral works, ballets, operas and chamber music. In the 1940s he developed a keen interest in Eastern philosophies and Armenian culture, which influenced his compositions. He began playing organ at an Armenian church and learned the Armenian language.




