

Open our hands to share freely and generously and stretch our hearts to new expressions of love.





MUSIC IN WORSHIP

This morning's opening hymn, "You Thirsty Ones, Come," is a paraphrase of today's Old Testament Lesson, Isaiah 55: 1 - 11 - "everyone who thirsts, come to the waters." The text, written by Andrew Donaldson (born 1951), uses an "abcb" rhyme scheme - the second and fourth lines rhyme with each other, but not the first and third lines. Even though there are no quotation marks, the first three and the last stanzas are the invitation of God, while the fourth stanza is the voice of the prophet. The melody, by James Clemens (born 1966), is a bit tricky in that there is no repetition or sequencing among the four phrases. Andrew Donaldson was born and raised in Ontario, Canada. He received the Bachelor of Arts degree from York University in Toronto and the Associate of Royal Conservatory Teacher degree at the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto. A lifelong church musician, he has composed in both French and English. In 2007 he was awarded the Doctor of Divinity by Knox College of the University of Toronto. He currently lives in Geneva, Switzerland, where he serves as a worship consultant to the World Council of Churches.

We welcome Ned Boyd, saxophone, to our worship service this morning. Ned has taught for 32 years on the high school and collegiate level and is currently Director of Bands at Logansport Community Schools. He received the Bachelor of Music Degree (and HS Diploma) in saxophone performance at the North Carolina School of the Arts; and a Master of Music degree in Education, with jazz emphasis from the Eastman School of Music. Prior to teaching, Ned was employed for two years as a musician on cruise ships, where he met his (Hoosier) wife, Jean. He has appeared with Aretha Franklin, George Benson, Michael Feinstein, Barry Manilow, Bernadette Peters, Pat Boone, Bobby Vinton, Bob Newhart, Wayne Newton the Four Tops, and Temptations to name a few. He has also played with the big bands Guy Lombardo, Lawrence Welk, and the Dorsey Brothers. He is a member of the Buselli/Wallarab Jazz Orchestra, and Steve Allee Big Band in Indianapolis. He has headlined at numerous jazz festivals around the state. including the Taste of Tippecanoe, and the Lafayette Jazz Club.
