I want you to take a moment to yourself as you read this and ask one question. Have you been giving the best that you can to God? We might narrow that focus and ask if we have been giving the best we have to God in our worship? When you assemble at Northwest (or any other congregation for that matter) do you do so with joy, eagerness, and anticipation? We might reflect on the pleasing sacrifice that Abel gave to God that we are told was made up of the best portions of what Abel had to offer. Remember that worship, and the way we live our lives, is often viewed as something that has been sacrificed, being described when done right as a “sweet smelling aroma” (Philippians 4:14-23).

So, ask yourselves if what you are giving to God in worship, and in your day-to-day life, is something that “smells sweet” to the Lord. Reflect on how God views simply going through the motions, or not giving your best, and see his responses. In Isaiah 1:13 God, speaking through the prophet, instructs the people who were not giving him their best and were not doing things how He desired them to be done to “stop bringing meaningless offerings! Your incense is detestable to me.” Call to mind the response to Cain’s sacrifice, it was rejected, and remember that Moses described Abel’s sacrifice as being the best of what he had, but what Cain brought was described as simply “some” of what he had.

I think you get the point. God does not just want the best we have to offer Him, He demands it. Paul tells us that it is reasonable for Him to expect as much (Romans 12:1). So once more I ask... are you giving your best to God? If you have not been, there is no better day than today to begin. -- Andrew
