
John 12:36b-43

Heart-change is necessary to be a faithful follower of Jesus



Observing powerful works and hearing consistent truth does not change hearts (12:36b-38)

^{36b} When Jesus had said these things, he departed and hid himself from them.

- * Knowing their sinful and hostile intent, Jesus leaves them and keeps out of their sight
- * The teaching of Jesus put a wet blanket on the hopes and dreams of the people
- ³⁷ Though he had done so many signs before them, they still did not believe in him,
- * There is no way His teaching and His power can be more clearly manifest
- Even though they claim they are looking for the Messiah, Jesus does not fulfill their desires
 - ♦ John I:II
- Their filters through death and unbelief are not open to the life and truth of God
 Romans 3:9–20
- Without life and light from God, no one comes to Jesus as Savior and Lord
 John 3:3

Observing powerful works and hearing consistent truth does not change hearts (12:36b-38)

- ³⁸ so that the word spoken by the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: "Lord, who has believed what he heard from us, and to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?"
- The rejection of the Jewish Messiah by Jewish people may seem surprising, but it anticipated in prophetic Scripture
 - * Isaiah 53:1
- God inspires the prophet to perceive two aspects of how the Messiah will be rejected
 - ❖ The word or the gospel will fall on deaf ears "Lord, who has believed what he heard from us..."
 - ❖ The power of the gospel will not be seen or valued by blind eyes "and to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?"

God's judgment to leave some in the condition of condemnation is justified (12:39-40)

- ³⁹ Therefore they could not believe. For again Isaiah said, ⁴⁰ "He has blinded their eyes and hardened their heart, lest they see with their eyes, and understand with their heart, and turn, and I would heal them."
- The inability to believe is the result of the just judgment of God against sinners
- Judicial hardening is the point made by the quote from Isaiah 6
 - * Isaiah 6:10
 - God's holy and righteous purpose is fulfilled in providing cleansing and forgiveness to Isaiah
 - * God's holy and righteous purpose is also fulfilled in the just judgment of sinners
- * People in a spiritually lifeless state cannot glorify God by doing what is right
 - ❖ Romans 8:7–8

God's judgment to leave some in the condition of condemnation is justified (12:39-40)

- Unregenerate people abide in the state of just condemnation before God as sinners by nature and by choice
 - ❖ John 3:17–18
 - ❖ John 3:36
 - ❖ Ephesians 2:1–5
- The Apostle Paul points out that prior to saving grace, all believers not only stood condemned, but we were active enemies of God
 - ❖ Romans 5:10
- The context of this passage in John indicates that those standing condemned, as those who cannot believe, abide under just judgment
 - ♦ John 12:37
 - ❖ John 12:43
- * This is written to reveal God's grace in salvation and God's justice in judgment
 - ❖ Romans 9:18

Valuing the favor of man over devotion to Jesus verifies condemnation (12:41-43)

- ⁴¹ Isaiah said these things because he saw his glory and spoke of him.
- The passage quoted is Isaiah 6 where the prophet Isaiah is given a vision of the Lord of hosts
 - ❖ Isaiah 6:1–5
 - * Who did Isaiah see?
 - Yahweh, the Lord of hosts
 - Whose glory does John say Isaiah saw?
 - !esus
- John again presents clear testimony of the deity of Jesus
 - ❖ John 1:1–3
 - * John 1:14
- We need to know and be able to share such clear statements of the deity of Jesus Christ!

Valuing the favor of man over devotion to Jesus verifies condemnation (12:41-43)

- ⁴² Nevertheless, many even of the authorities believed in him, but for fear of the Pharisees they did not confess it, so that they would not be put out of the synagogue; ⁴³ for they loved the glory that comes from man more than the glory that comes from God.
- John recounts many people and leaders believing in Jesus
- * Because of the threats of excommunication from public religious life, the people believing in Jesus are too afraid to identify openly as followers of Jesus
 - ❖ John 9:22
- John has given examples in his gospel of those who believe in Jesus, but their belief is not unto salvation (Cf. John 2:23-23; 6:60; 8:30-31)
- They had mental understandings of significant facts about Jesus but were lacking spiritual life and transformed loyalties
 - * Matthew 10:33
- When people who claim to believe in Jesus value the favor of men over devotion to Jesus, this verifies they remain under condemnation
 - * Hebrews 10:35-39

Questions to Consider

- * Are you faithful in sharing the authoritative truth of God, knowing that it is only God who changes heart?
- In what ways are you showing you are willing to share the truth even if it is rejected?
- * How are you witnessing the grace of God in your life to value devotion to Jesus more than valuing the favor of people?
