KNOW THE CONSEQUENCES OF STOPPING ATTENDANCE/DROPPING/FAILING

DROPPING, WITHDRAWING OR FAILING A CLASS CAN AFFECT YOUR FINANCIAL AID AND ACADEMIC STANDING. YOU MAY NEED TO REPAY YOUR FINANCIAL AID OR LOSE FEDERAL AND STATE PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY.

BEFORE YOU MAKE YOUR DECISION, CONSIDER THESE MATTERS.

HOPE & HOPE ACCESS SCHOLARSHIP

If you begin the semester with 12 credit hours or more and stop attending or drop below 12 credit hours, you will lose future eligibility for your lottery scholarship
If you begin the semester with 6-11 credit hours and drop below 6 credit hours, you will lose this scholarship.

FEDERAL PELL/SEOG GRANT

If you drop or stop attending ALL of your courses, a Return to Title IV (R2T4) will be calculated and you may owe money back to NSCC.

TN PROMISE

A student must maintain a full-time enrollment (at least 12 credit hours). TN Promise students must complete and submit community service as instructed by TnAchieves and maintain a 2.0 GPA at the end of each academic year (fall, spring, summer).

TN RECONNECT

TN Reconnect recipients are required to enroll and attend 6 or more credit hours to maintain eligibility for the TN Reconnect Scholarship. If you drop below 6 credit hours, you will lose future eligibility for the TN Reconnect Scholarship.

Eligibility requirements are subject to change.

If a student withdraws from all classes prior to the Census Date (14th Day of Classes) financial aid will NOT cover funds owed to Nashville State Community College. Student may be responsible for any outstanding balance.

If a student stops attending or never attends (unofficial-withdrawal), drops (W), or fails (F) one or more classes, it can affect SAP and future financial aid. Anyone on an approved Academic Plan may lose financial aid eligibility. ALWAYS check program impact before you make a decision.

SUBSIDIZED, UNSUBSIDIZED & PLUS STUDENT LOANS

If you fall below 6 credit hours, any subsequent loans will be cancelled. You must complete Exit Loan Counseling and your six month grace period prior to repayment will begin.

FEDERAL WORK STUDY

If you withdraw, drop or stop attending a course it does not affect FWS as long your are still enrolled and academically engaged in 6 in-program credit hours. If you drop, withdraw or stop attending all in-program classes, you are not eligible to work.

Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)

Your SAP is reviewed at the end of each semester. You are required to maintain the required PACE (67% completion rate) of attempted classes and meet the GPA requirement. A partial or total withdrawal can affect your SAP and future financial aid eligibility. Please review the SAP infographic for more information.
