



NASHVILLE STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE FOUNDATION AMBASSADOR SCHOLARSHIP

The Nashville State Community College Foundation Ambassador Scholarship is made possible by contributions from NSCC faculty and staff, area businesses and corporations, private foundations, individual friends of the college, and Nashville State Foundation Trustees. The scholarship is funded through the Nashville State Foundation Scholarship Account and will be awarded to a maximum of four (4) individuals who are chosen to serve as student Ambassadors for the college. Recipients are awarded a maximum of \$1000 per year.

To apply, please submit your NSCC Ambassador Scholarship application to the Admissions Office. Applications will be accepted during the spring semester each year with service beginning in the fall semester of that year. **Scholarships are awarded to qualified applicants based on the following criteria.** Awards will be made contingent upon available funding.

Scholarship Criteria:

- Applicants are required to submit an application and two letters of recommendation.
- Applicants must have a minimum 3.0 GPA and have completed at least 12 hours of college level credit at NSCC.
- Students receiving the NSCC Foundation Ambassador scholarship in the Fall must maintain a 3.0 GPA and re-enroll to remain eligible to receive the Spring disbursement.
- Applicants must sign a Code of Ethics, adhere to the Student Code of Conduct, and participate in Student Life events and meetings.
- Applicants will be required to serve 60 hours each semester they receive the scholarship. Applicants will serve as an official representative of the college by helping with on and off campus events such as orientation, tours, meeting with prospective students, and graduation. If a student fails to complete their work obligation prior to the end of the semester, they will lose future eligibility for the scholarship.

Applicable maintenance fee/tuition refunds will be credited to the scholarship except in cases when the student is also receiving federal Title IV benefits and totally withdraws. In such cases, the refund is credited back to the appropriate program(s) according to the NSCC "Return of Title IV Funds" Policy.
