The Ted M. Washington Memorial Scholarship was created with the generous support of family, friends, faculty, and staff of NSCC. The Foundation is proud to continue to honor Ted's legacy through this scholarship designed to provide financial support to male NSCC students with a demonstrated financial need. The scholarship is funded through the Ted M. Washington Memorial Endowed Fund. Recipients are awarded a maximum of \$ 1500.00 each year.

To apply, please submit your NSCC Financial Aid and Scholarship Application through your myNSCC. <u>You</u> must complete this application each year. Awards will be made contingent upon available funding.

In order to be considered for the scholarship:

- Applicant must complete the Free Application for Federal student Aid (FAFSA) and complete verification, if applicable. If additional documents are requested, please note NSCC Financial Aid Office priority deadline of <u>July 1st</u> for submission.
- Applicant must be enrolled as a degree-seeking student to attend Nashville State. Applicant
 must be a current year high school graduate and have graduated on or after May 1st preceding
 start of award year.
- Applicant must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours.
- If applicant has previously completed college-level coursework, applicant must have earned a 2.0 cumulative grade point average.
- Applicants must be in good academic standing and meet satisfactory academic progress standards, as measured for federal Title IV Programs.

To continue receiving the award, the criteria above must be met and:

- Student must maintain a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.5
- Student must successfully complete at least 12 credit hours per semester in order to be eligible for continued disbursement in the following semester.
- Student must re-enroll in at least 12 credit hours.

Applicable maintenance fee / tuition refunds will be credited to the scholarship except in cases when the student is also receiving federal Title IV benefits and totally withdraws. In such cases, the refund is credited back to the appropriate program(s) according to the NSCC "Return of Title IV Funds" Policy.
