The Georgia Association for Nursing Education, Inc. has had a long and rich history. The Georgia Association for Nursing Education, Inc. originally began as The Georgia State League for Nursing in 1927. A group of nurse educators within the state joined forces to establish the

organization. Their original purpose was to help assure consistency in the quality of curricula among nursing programs in the state. The Georgia State League for Nursing was incorporated on October 31, 1958 under the leadership of president Dorothy Buffington. In 1977, under the leadership of president Marlene P. Mitchell, the organization became a constituent league of the National League for Nursing and changed its name to The Georgia League for Nursing. In November of 2003, the membership determined that a non-affiliated organization would draw a wider representation in the state. The vote was made to disaffiliate from NLN and become independent without affiliation to any national organization. In September 2004, the Georgia Association for Nursing Education was granted its new corporate status from the State of Georgia. In January of 2005, GANE was recognized by the IRS as a 501 (c)(3) nonprofit organization.

The purpose of the Georgia Association for Nursing Education is to promote excellence in nursing education within the state of Georgia. This purpose is carried out through its functions that include:

- 1. Assess the needs of Georgia nurse educators and nurses.
- 2. Initiate, stimulate and support nursing education at clinical and academic levels, both formally and informally, thereby addressing the healthcare needs of Georgia's citizenry.
- 3. Participate in and promote nursing research at the local and state level that is designed to address nursing education and healthcare needs
- 4. Collaborate with nursing and other professional groups to positively influence nursing education, nursing regulation and healthcare delivery.

Today, GANE has 300 members and holds an annual conference in February. There are many opportunities to work on GANE committees in many capacities. Please contact a GANE executive board member to join in our growing organization.

Sara Horton-Deutsch, PhD, PMHCNS, RN, FAAN, ANEF, GAHN, Caritas Coach & Scholar Professor and Director of University of San Francisco/Kaiser Permanente Partnership Watson Caring Science Faculty Associate and Director of the Caritas Leadership Program

Dr. Horton-Deutsch has led in academic and practice settings for 35 years as an advanced practice psychiatric/mental health nurse, teacher/practitioner, consultant, program director, caring science endowed chair, coach, and academic/practice partnership director. In 2022, she was inducted into the Global American Holistic Nursing. Through her academic and practice career, she has contributed to evidence and practice-based knowledge development to ensure safety and quality care. As a reflective leader, she focuses on being inwardly sound and other focused to influence change positively. She has co-authored a number of books on Reflective Practice, Caring Science, and Caritas Coaching. She is a Caritas Coach, HeartMath Trainer, Reiki Practitioner, and Healing Circle Facilitator. Through her journey, she has learned the necessity of connecting to one's own inner sources of wisdom, power, and healing, as well as the arts and humanities that once defined the discipline of nursing. She is passionate about facilitating critical, deep, and authentic connections that support resilience and the profession's evolution. She has a new book; *Visionary Leadership in Healthcare* being published this month through SIGMA. She is currently on the Board of Directors of SIGMA and Co-Director of the Caritas Leadership Program for the Watson Caring Science Institute.

Theresa Brown, RN

Theresa Brown, RN, is the author of the *New York Times* bestseller *The Shift: One Nurse, Twelve Hours, Four Patients' Lives.* In this book, Brown offers a revealing look at the struggles of one nurse, the challenges faced by her patients, and some larger truths about health care in this country.

Brown is a frequent contributor to the *New York Times*. One of her columns earned her an invitation to the White House, where President Obama quoted her in defense of the Affordable Care Act. Brown's work has also appeared on CNN.com, *The Journal of the American Medical Association*, Medscape, *Slate.com*, and the *Pittsburgh Post-Gazette*. She has been a guest on MSNBC Live and NPR's *Fresh Air*.

Theresa's latest book, *Healing: When a Nurse Becomes a Patient*, is a powerful and intensely personal story about her own breast cancer diagnosis and treatment as well as a searing look at patient care.

A native of Missouri, Brown has a PhD in English from the University of Chicago and taught English for three years at Tufts University. Her three children inspired her to return to school

and become a nurse. She is a frequent speaker at hospitals, nursing conferences, and universities where she lectures on issues related to nursing, health care, and end of life.
