STATEMENT OF NEED

Pain management remains a hot topic as clinicians determine appropriate interventions and best practices in light of rising concerns over addiction disease. To address pharmacologic strategies, the role of the EMT, the role of prescribers, and the value of preoperative pain assessment programs, Hospital for Special Surgery (HSS) will host the 11th Annual Pain Awareness Program, Pain Management in 2017: Issues, Challenges & Treatments. Faculty includes clinicians from the Pain Management Service at HSS, which has board certified physicians with dedicated practices in pain management that take a multifaceted approach to individualized treatment plans. HSS and guest faculty from emergency medical services, physiatry, neurology, and anesthesiology will discuss this approach and other best practices to manage current challenges in the field.

TARGET AUDIENCE

This activity is targeted to registered nurses, nurse practitioners, social workers, case managers, and physician assistants.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

HSS professional education activities are intended to improve the quality of patient care and safety. At the completion of the course, participants will:

- Define the role and responsibility of prescribers in ensuring safe and legal prescriptive practice.
- Describe pharmacologic strategies used in treating pain in the patient with an addiction disease.
- Discuss the interventional role of the EMT/first responder in responding to an emergency call for drug overdose.
- Recognize the value of a preoperative pain assessment program in identifying and defining a plan of care for patients planning to have elective orthopaedic surgery.
