MASHN CONFERENCE SPEAKERS 2017



Kathleen D. Pagana, PhD, RN

President, Pagana Keynotes & Presentations Professor Emeritus, Lycoming College, Williamsport, PA

Kathy has a BSN from the University of Maryland and a MSN and PhD in Nursing from the University of Pennsylvania. She has been a leader in healthcare for more than 40 years with experiences including military service, clinical practice, college teaching, administration, and consulting. She has recently been designated as a "Certified Speaking Professional" by the National Speakers' Association.

Kathy has written more than 90 articles. She and her husband are the co-authors of 29 books with translations in French, Chinese, Korean, Greek, Spanish, Polish, and Portuguese. Nearly 2 million copies of the Pagana & Pagana *Mosby's Diagnostic and Laboratory Test* Reference have sold worldwide.

The second edition of *The Nurse's Etiquette Advantage* received an AJN Book of the Year Award in 2015. Kathy is also a contributing author of *Chicken Soup for the Nurse's Soul*. Her newest book title is *The Nurse's Communication Advantage*.

Kathy's involvement in healthcare extends from the Board Room to the Bedside. Being a member of the Board of Directors of a regional medical center has helped Kathy understand the complexity of health care and the ongoing challenges for quality patient care in an environment of cost containment. She keeps current in nursing practice by working in a hospital several days a month.



Whitman-Walker Health



Jennafer joined Metro TeenAIDS (MTA) in September 2014 to lead the new LGBTQ Youth Wellness Initiative, funded by the Washington AIDS Partnership. She joined Whitman-Walker Health (WWH) in February 2015 when MTA and WWH joined forces. Prior to MTA/WWH, Jennafer was the Director of Programs at The Women's Collective, a community-based organization in DC providing social support services to women and girls with or at-risk for HIV, where she was responsible for overseeing the Care, Prevention, and Policy & Advocacy departments. She is a public health researcher by training, with a focus on social and behavioral sciences, holding positions previously at Abt Associates, RTI International, HRSA HIV/AIDS Bureau, and the Maryland AIDS Administration. She holds both doctoral and master's degrees from Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health.

Timothy Elliott, MSW, LICSW

Whitman-Walker Health



Timothy is a licensed clinical social worker in the DMV area who has a passion for supporting LGBTQ youth. He has been working within the community since 2009 and currently serves as the Coordinator of LGBT Youth Mental Health Programs at Whitman-Walker Health, a federally qualified health center in DC. In his role with WWH, Timothy developed and coordinates the LGBT youth mental health program - providing low-barrier, comprehensive outpatient mental health services for LGBTQ youth and young adults affected by crime. Additionally, he provides therapy and clinical trainings through his private practice located in Northern Virginia focusing on supporting gender expansive children, youth and their families. He has previously held the role of the Program Coordinator for Rainbow Youth Alliance, an adult-facilitated, peer-to-peer support group for LGBTQ youth and their allies in Rockville, MD; currently he serves as a member on the RYA Advisory Council providing clinical direction and strategic planning for the organization. As a Social Worker, Timothy strives to encourage and develop safe, affirming spaces for all LGBTQ youth and their allies. Timothy is often seen as the "squeaky wheel" in agencies and organizations he works with; he tirelessly advocates for needed changes in how we are supporting our LGBTQ youth. He obtained his bachelor's degree in Social Work from the University of Maryland, Baltimore County and his Master's of Social Work degree from Andrews University in Michigan. In addition, he has completed advanced training and certification programs around both trauma treatment, expressive therapies, and co-occurring disorders. He works with several local universities guest lecturing on issues around youth mental health, trauma, and the specifics needs of LGBTQ youth - committed to lifting youth voices and challenging providers to do better. His experience working within schools, outpatient mental health facilities, and government agencies has provided him with a vast knowledge and respect for how multiple systems work together. He has spoken at national conferences on various topics within youth mental health and meeting the unique needs of LGBTQ youth. In May 2017, Timothy was awarded the 2017 Youth Champion of the Year award by the DC Center for the LGBT Community's Youth Working Group.

Marcee J. White, MD, FAAP

Children's National Health Center

Dr. Marcee White brings a wealth of school and community health experience. She is a board certified pediatrician who serves as the pediatric consultant for Children's National's School Health Services Program and Medical Director of four school-based wellness centers in Prince George's County, Maryland. She is also the Medical Director of Children's National's Mobile Health Program, Children's Health Project of DC and the Children's Health Center at the Town Hall Education Arts Recreation Campus (THEARC) in Washington, DC. Dr. White is an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at George Washington University.

Under her leadership, the Children's Health Center at THEARC has integrated behavioral health services, expanded its social support programs to address the social determinants of health and has been designated as a Level 3 Patient-Centered Medical Home by the National Committee for Quality Assurance. She is currently in the process of implementing the Children's Health Fund's Healthy and Ready to Learn Initiative to screen and address health barriers to learning. Dr. White co-led Children's National's transparency initiative which resulted in Children's National becoming the first freestanding children's hospital to share provider satisfaction ratings from patients and families on its public website.

Dr. White earned her medical degree from George Washington University School of Medicine and a bachelor of science in biology pre-medicine from Xavier University of Louisiana. She completed her pediatric residency training from the combined Children's National and Howard University Community Health Track. Prior to joining the faculty at Children's National, she served as Chief Pediatric Resident. Dr. White has a certificate in leadership development from the George Washington University Master Teacher Leadership Development Program.

Dr. White is the President of the DC Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics and also serves on the board of directors for Martha's Table and DC Action for Children. She is the physician lead for the Central Southern Maryland Pediatric Medical Society and is a member of numerous committees such as the Prince George's County Maryland Department of Health Behavioral Health Workgroup and System of Care Core Planning team, the DC Pediatric Oral Health Coalition, and the SafeKids DC Coalition. She serves as the medical advisor to SafeKids Worldwide.



Mark O'Brien, JD

Baltimore City Health Department

Mark is a nationally recognized expert on addiction prevention and treatment and employment, housing, and other collateral consequences of criminal records.

He is a co-author of Legal Action Center's Roadmap for Promoting Health and Justice: A Smarter, More Effective National Drug and Alcohol Policy. His writing has appeared in the Baltimore Sun, Huffington Post, Addiction Blog, and the National Institute on Drug Abuse blog.

He is an accomplished public speaker with presentations before the American Bar Association, U.S. House of Representatives, U.S. Interagency Reentry Council, NASA, American Constitution Society, Poynter Institute, and many others.

Mark currently serves as the Director of Opioid Overdose Prevention and Treatment for Baltimore City. He is responsible for implementing the Baltimore City Opioid Overdose Prevention and Response Plan that has been cited as a national model by President Barack Obama, the U.S. Surgeon General, and the U.S. Director of National Drug Control Policy. He leads Baltimore's Citywide Fentanyl Task Force, consisting of over 20 city and state agencies and organizations, as well as the city's Overdose Fatality Review Team.

Mark previously was a Senior Criminal Justice Policy Associate and Director of Communications in Legal Action Center's Washington, D.C. office where he advocated to reduce social and legal barriers for people with criminal records and addictions and expand access to substance use disorder treatment. He was a co-chair of the Reentry Working Group of the Justice Roundtable, a coalition of over 100 organizations working for a fairer and more equitable justice system. He has provided technical assistance to dozens of criminal justice agencies to implement health interventions that improve public safety and community wellbeing.

He is a certified Offender Employment Specialist and has provided reentry and employment support services to people coming home from prison. He is a graduate of Towson University and Georgetown University Law Center.
