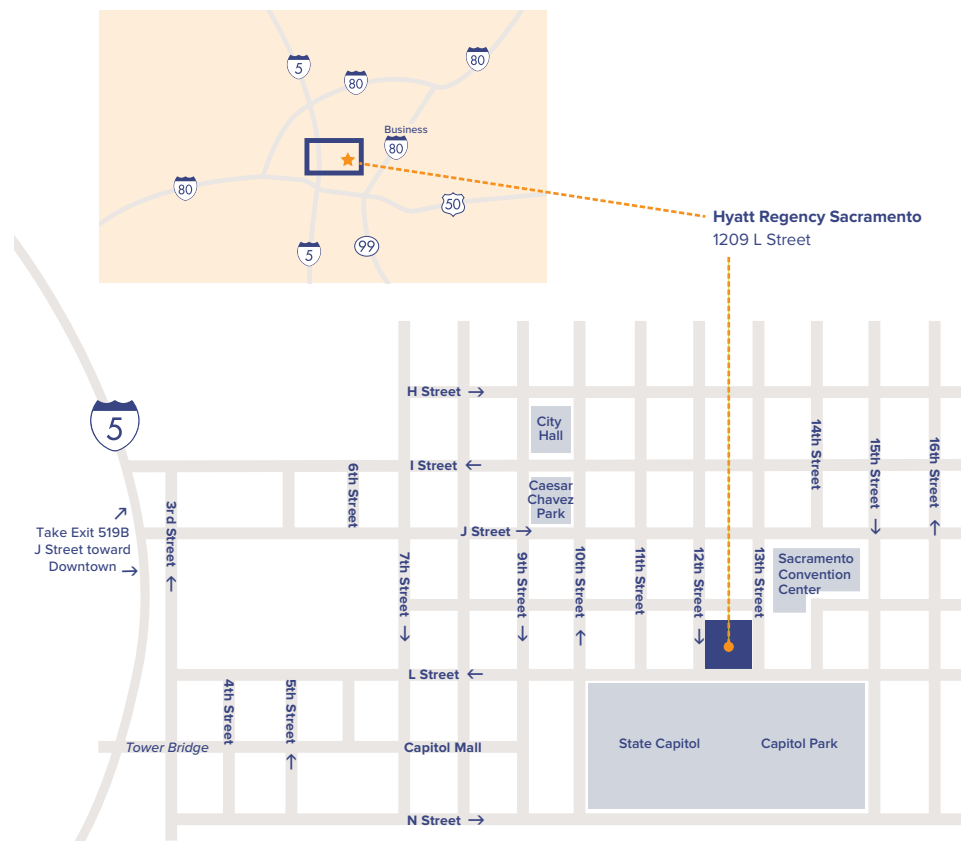

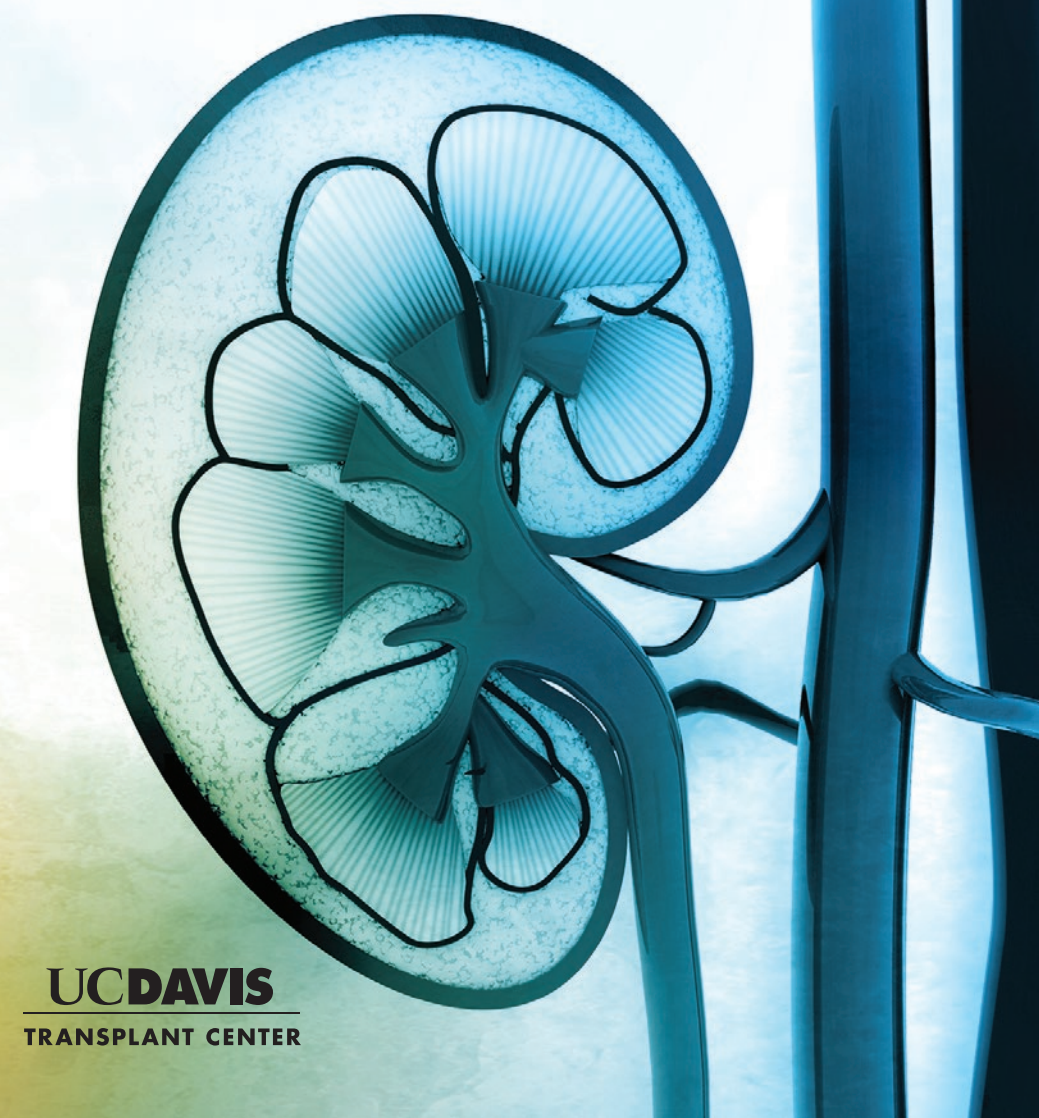
PARKING

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DESCRIPTION AND COURSE OBJECTIVES

This conference is directed toward nephrologists and members of the health care team involved in the management of patients with acute and chronic renal disease and pre- and post-renal transplant patients. This year’s conference will feature a dedicated track for nurses, social workers and dialysis center staff interested in expanding their knowledge of transplantation. Attendees will learn about the transplant process to better educate dialysis patients along the path to transplant. The overall objective is to provide an update on selected topics in clinical nephrology and renal transplantation with hands-on advice.

- Outline new strategies to expand the number of patients who benefit from living donor kidney transplantation.
- Review the evolving practice in the treatment of the patient with end stage renal disease and atrial fibrillation.

- Describe important developments in the diagnosis and treatment of diabetic nephropathy.
